week completed training in use of week "breapthalyzer" which analyzes
the suspect's breath to determine the percentage of alcohol in his loodstream.
The DPS recentiy secured a
Federal grant of $\$ 114,627$ to launch the breath testing project. Funds
obtained under the grant were obtained onder the grant were
matahed with State funds and used
to buy 90 breathalyzer instrutments, to hire sixix addiditional chem-
ists for supervision of the program, and to train the DPS per-
sonnel in use of the equipment.
"We plan to locate breathalyzers We plan to locate breathalyzers
in about 80 of the state's most
populous countries where the driv-
