However, in spite of this they believed that they could accomplish nothing without the help of the Almighty. They felt the awesome responsibility which they bore for the destiny of our nation and its citizens; and they prayed for divine guidance before making the decisions on which our freedom and our system of justice would depend for all time. They saw themselves as merely the instruments of God's will, and it was this very humility that earned them their place in the history books and in our hearts. We who are responsible for only ourselves and our families could learn much from our founding fathers; therefore, we should attend our House of Worship and thank God for their foresight which has allowed us, among other things, to choose it.
