## Land Diversion Payments Total $\$ 940,000$

Briscoe County farmers participating in the 1985 wheat and upland cotton programs received approximately $\$ 940,000.00$ for the paid diversion portion of their total acreage conservation reserve requirements. The land diversion payments compensate larmers for taking additiona cropland out of production after meeting regular acreage reduc tion requirements.
Designed to control excess crop supplies and maintain level of stocks in line with market demand, the 1985 programs authorized a 20 percent acreage reduction with a 10 percent paid land diversion for wheat and upland cotton. The paid diversion resulted in a total reduction of 11,000 acres of the eligible wheat and upland cotton creage.
Payment rates were $\$ 2.70$ per bushel for wheat and 30 cents per pound for cotton. The land diversion payments were compu led by multiplying the payment ate times the farm yield times the acres diverted. Program participants were eligible to receive half of their payments when they signed up and the balance after reporting their 1985 crop acreages.
In addition to land diversion payments, farmers who comply with program provisions will be eligible for target price protec tion, price support loans and ther program benefits.
Based on the enrollment re port, Briscoe County farmers diverted 33,000 acres of cropland rom production to the acreage conservation reserve through land diversion programs.

## "Start a Habit For Life"

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration is spon soring All-American Buckle-Up using the theme, "Start a Habit for Life." Residents of the Siverton community are challen ged to join the All-American Buckle-Up. Through the coopera tive elforts of people like you, and hundreds of organizations nation wide, this is a perfect time o "Start a Habit for Life.
Area law enforcement officers began "vigorous enforcement" of the state's seat belt law December 1 . They will be pulling over people who arent wearing their belts and ticketing them. Officers have been issuing warning cita tions when they noticed people weren't wearing seat belts while committing other infractions. Or al warnings have been given by most officers.
That changed December 1 Violating the ordinance is a Class C misdemeanor, like most traffic violations, and it carries a fine of fine of between $\$ 25$ and $\$ 50$.
Statistics show that wearing seat belts saves lives. It is estimated that 70 to 80 percent of Texas drivers are complying with the new law.
One major problem in the predominantly rural areas is the single-car accident, which comprises about 44 percent of the area's accidents. Many deaths in such accidents occur when people are thrown from their cars, which wouldn't happen if they were wearing seat belts. In the summer of 1984, state legislators in New York took a bold step toward reducing the number of persons killed and injured in motor vehicle crashes. They enacted a mandatory safety belt use law, making the Empire State the first in the nation to have such a law.
New York acted with good reason: motor yehicle crashes are the leading cause of violent death for persons between the ages of six and fifty. Safety belts are 40 to 50 percent effective in preventing fataiities and 45 to 55 percent effective in reducing serious injuries. Many European countries have had such laws on the books for years and have proven that bele laws save lives and reduce crippling injuries. Despite the overwhelming evi dence of safety belt effectiveaess, there have been only Delts Belts are avallable in almost every motor vehicle on the road today, and have been for some time. But most motorists do ne in a car and don't use them.
Meanwhile, the tragic carnage Meanwhile, the tragic carnage
on our roads continues. In 1984 there were 44,241 traffic fatalities in this country and more thes in $1 / 2$ million injuries More than two-thirds of those killed than two-thirds of motor ve hicles. Most of the deaths and injuries were preventable.

The New York law has an New York in October 1984 efore that state's safety belt law
went into effect, showed only 16 percent usage rate by drivers and their front seat passengers. in March of 1985, after the law had been in effect only three months, the use rate jumped to around 60 percent.
More important, the state reported an 18 percent decline in
occupant fatalities during the first six months the new law was in effeet when compared to the same period in 1984.
As of September 1985, 13 other states, including Texas, have enacted safety belt laws. Many other states will consider Many other states will consider
similar action during their 1986 legislative sessions.
Most of the opposition to such laws has come from individuals and groups who raise the ques. tion of infringement on personal freedoms. The mandatory use laws, they argue, are a classic illustration of government intrusion. Legislators believe that the issue of personal freedom does not apply. The states have always exercised powers relating to the health and safety of their citizens, including the regulation of motor vehicle operation. The usual Constitutional test of any law is not whether it imposes restraints on individual behavior, but whether those restraints achieve a public benefit.

In short, a driver's freedom of choice must be balanced against choice must be balanced against right, for example, not to be burdened by the over $\$ 65$ billion annual social cost of motor vehicle accidents, injuries and deaths. The fact is, when a motor vehicle crash occurs, all pay

also logically support the repeal of most public health and safety laws, such as required immuniza. tions and health standards for restaurants.
The human costs of motor vehicle crashes are especially tragic. Motor vehicle fatalities are never expected events When they happen, they not only shatter individual lives but leave behind a legacy of emotional and financial hardship for the next of kin to endure. There are also hundreds of thousands of accident victims who never fully dent victims who never fully Many of them become parapleg. ics, quadraplegics or epileptics. Safety belts offer the best Safety belts offer the best human and economic costs im human and economic costs imthat if all front seat occupants in passenger cars who do not use their belts now buckled their belts, between 8,000 and 10,000 fatalities a year could be prevent ed and serious injuries could be reduced by more than 135,00 each year.

## Lady Patriots Win Lorenzo Tournament

Valley High's Lady Patriots were winners of the Lorenzo Tournament played December 5-6-7, while the Patriots lost two close games there by a total of seven points
The Lady Patriots played Ralls in the first round of the tournament, taking a $55-42$ victory. Leading the offense were Fulbright with a big 22 points, Maupin with 11 and Brittian with 10.

The Lady Pats led at the end of three quarters, 124 at the first stop, trailed 22.24 at halftime, then led 36-95 at the end of three periods.

In the second round of the tournament with Roosevelt, the Lady Patriots jumped out to a big $17-10$ lead at the end of the first period but had fallen behind $18-20$ at halftime. They finished the third period with the score knotted at 27.27 , but went on to take the one-point, $36-35$, vietory. Leading scorers were Fulbright with 12 and Brittian with 10.

The Patriots won their first
game $77-36$ over Ralls, with balanced scoring by Beavers 15 , Saut 14 and Williams 12. By quarters, Valley led 18-14, 39-20, 60-31 and 77-36.
In the second game, the Roosevelt boys took a 77.76 decision over the Patriots. After falling behind in the first quarter, 14-26, the Patriots continued to trail at halftime, 33-50. Valley rallied in the third quarter to trail 52.58 and continued to rally in the fourth period to finish just a point behind, 76-77.
Leading scorers were Wil liams, who canned a big 27 points, Cox with 17 and Saul with 12.

In their third game of the tournament, the Patriots fell to Shallowater, 61-67.
The Patriots had built a lead, 18-8, at the end of the first quarter, but fell behind $28-95$ at the midway stop. Valley trailed 42-47 at the third period buzzer and finished on the short end of the 61-67 score.
Leading the scoring for Valley were Williams with 17 and Saul with 14.
Friday night at Quanah, the teams took a pair of victories. The Lady Patriots earned a $42-27$ victory while the Patriots won 48-36.

## Longer Lasting

 EvergreensThose real, live, evergreens can spruce up the holidays with a special fragrance and beauty of their garland or a sprig here and there, they add real festivity there, they add real festivity to the holiday season.

There are glossy broadleafs like the magnolia, boxwood, or holly, and also the and pine.

## and pine.

These evergreens should be soaked in a bucket of water out in the fresh air for at least 24 hours. Cut the ends on a slant, or split or crush the ends with a hammer in order for the water to be more easily absorbed.
After the 24 hours, cut the stems straight across and seal the water in by dipping the stems in candle wax Rub or dip the broadleafed evergreens with a l quid, self-polishing floor wax. This coating forms a vapor barrier that will help to slow evaporation. The wax will also help to keep berries of nandina, pyra-
cantha or holly more securely on their twigs.

Enjoy those evergreens in your creative mood this Christmas!

## Fringed Centerpiece Tree

For a pretty little tree to use as a table's centerpiece, cut a large piece of paper into a half circle, making it two times longer than it is wide. Roll this circle into a wone and tape the cone to gether. Trim the base of the gether. Trim the base of the Cut a package of green crepe paper into strips while still folded. (You may wish to use tin foil for a silver tree or green florists' cellophane paper.) While the strips are still folded, slit them halfway up for fringes. Now open the strips
