**Brownies Observe Founder's Day**

In honor of the sixtieth birthday of the founding of the Girl Scouts of America, the Quitaque Brownie Troop 107 and the Junior Girl Scout Troop 107 attended services at the Methodist Church on Sunday, March 12. This was the first appearance of the girls in public in their uniforms.

Mothers of Brownies probably shook their heads in bewilderment as the girls attempted to urge the remainder of Saturday away by taking a bath in the afternoon without urging or parental prompting. For many Brownies, time passed rather slowly that Saturday. In the meeting of March 7, six girls were invested. They were Keeli Cox, Cindy Hawkins, Diana Martinez, Lisa Payne, Nadine Rice, and Mary Kay Swift. The girls have begun working on coordination skills such as obtained on the bamboo poles and the double jump rope. One of the first lessons learned at the meeting was that of cleaning up after refreshments. Most Brownies agreed that eating neatly would have been much simpler than that of cleaning up the deserted plates, cups and crumbs. At the close of the meeting, they were "zapped" away by Mrs. Tena Cox. Brownies are supposed to disappear at the snap of the leader's fingers, but instead of leaving on feet "made of cotton," the way "Good Brownies" do, our Scouts made the house vibrate with their disappearance. However, the leaders are convinced that "practice will make perfect." With enthusiasm as displayed by these Brownies, there is no doubt that activities will remain lively. Mrs. Jean Rice and Mrs. Helen Swift are additional leaders for the group.

The Junior Girl Scout Troop 107 invested five girls: Judy Barrett, Cindy Griffin, Kelly Hawkins, Lisa Herrington and Truette Stephens. Judy Barrett flew up from the Brownies and received her Brownie Fly-Up Wings which will be exchanged for the real fly-up wings that will be worn on her badge sash. She was the only girl who had previously been a Brownie. The girls will begin work on a cooking badge. In order for the girls to obtain the special award, the Sign of the Arrow, they must complete several badges, including that of cooking. Since the girls are inexperienced as Scouts, they will work together as a Troop on some badges. As they become more proficient, they will branch out on individual work. The girls will watch a demonstration in preparing a meal from pre-packaged, convenience foods. The following week will see them preparing, under supervision, an electric skillet meal, garlic bread sticks, and a refrigerator pie, all from convenience foods. With the assistance of pre-packaged foods, the girls' first attempt in cooking should be quite successful; family members who will be asked to share the girl's dinner have no reason to be reluctant to sample the dinner. In time, the girls will learn to cook many other dishes from "scratch." Their lessons in cooking are not comparable to those of homemak-
