## ＂Turkey＂

Back when the streets of Turkey were being paved down
through the main part of town，some of the dirt had to be removed from the street．This was done by a walking turning plow，pulled by two extra large horses then hauled out by a frisno operated by hand and also pulled by the horses． and had to be removed before the paving took place street weighed several tons and no heavy machinery to move it with． It was decided to dig a large hole in the street and bury it，which they did．The monument was built back about 1920 by a committee from Oklahoma and the two closest ones still
standing is by the old Tampico store building about seven standing is by the old Tampico store building about seven
miles east of Turkey and one at the court house square in Tulia． Before the street was paved，telephone poles had been put in
front of the stores by the side walk on the north side of the street， and about twenty wires to each pole．The wires went to a central office where an operator was on duty twenty four hours a day and laid all the poles down in the street．This caused the telephone company a lot of
