Any adult born after 1956 who is unsure of whether they have had measles or the vaccine should be im-
munized. Anyone born after 1956 and immunized prior to 1968 should be re-immunized.
be vaccinated before coming to Houston.
Every child 6-months or
older who has not older who has not had the measles! vaccine must be
immunized immediately This is especially important since 70 percent of the reported cases are infants 6 months of age to 5 -year-old children.
Measles is a serious
disease which can lead to disease which can lead to
hospitalzation if not treated. Any parent who suspects their child of having measles should contact a doctor immediately. All doctors must report measles cases to city and county health officials.
