## The Veterans' Monument On The CourtHouse Lawn


The monumen was errected March 18, , 1924. More than 3.000 people crowded the courthouse lawn and public
 Wells. The "Star Spangled Banner" and 'America" were played and sung by the glee club. At the conclusion of the program, people assembled for the unveling of the monument. The monument is made of white marble, and is 10
feet 6 inches high, and 8 feet 2 inches wide. On the base of the monument are some of the names of the veterans from Hall County, who fought in these two wars.
On April 12,1928 , an article was put in the Memphis Democrat urging the citizens of Hall County to help keep the monument protected. Several inches of the barrel of the gun held by the World War soldier had been broken off attracto attention from visitors and tourists. The monument belongs th Hall County and is sacred to the memory of the men and boys who fought at home and overseas to make our country a safe place in which to live. When the
WWI veterans of Hall County came home they left 20 comrades on Flanders Field. On June 5,1986 the article appeared in the Memphis Democrat with a picture of the dedication of an additional Simmons Noel Poot 175 of the American Legion and Memphis VFW Poost 10686 sponsored the dedication ceremony. The momorat has a reple monogram of the American Legion, Disabled American Veterans, and the Veterans of
Foreign Wars and read In Merory of All Veterans of All Wars" dedicated by Simmons Noel Post 175 , Memphis Lets pay tribute to all veterans memories in protecting our monuments. Now in this day and time another threat
