Social Security Benefit Increases By Working Longer

Summer-the season for rising
temperatures and numerous out temperatures and numerous out-
door activities-is in full swing.
However, time spentin the swelter-
ing heat can take its toll unless
some precautions are taken.
When exercising or playing out-
door sports, drink plenty of fiquids
to reppenish the body's fuids. Ac-
cording to Chuck Barton, M.D.,
medicial director of MMethodist Hos-
pitals Emergency Room, if an ade-
quate amount of fluids are not re-
placed, dehydration can result.
"One warning sign of dehydra-
tion is heat cramps," Dr. Barton tion is heat cramps," Dr. Barton
said. "If cramping occurs, sit down -and relax, dab yourself with wet
towels and drink plenty of cool water."
Heat exhaustion, a more serious condition, can follow dehydration.
However, it does not necessarily occur immediately; instead, it can
take several days or even weeks to develop. Symptoms of heat exhaus. ion can include cool clammy skin,
headdache, nauusea, dizziness, pro-
fuse sweating and an elevated tem perature.
To treat heat exhaustion, loosen To treat heat exhaustion, loosen
or remove tight clothing, lay down
with feet propped up and drink wath feet propped up and drink
water. When symptoms begin to subside a little, seek medical atten-
tion. The worst case scenario is heat stroke. Symptoms include a red
blotchy face which thenturns white,
dizziness and confusion, and cessadizziness and confusion, and cessaion of perspiration. and emergency personnel should be notified immediately.
"Until paramedicsarrive, cool the body by fanning and soaking in cool water or wrapping in wet sheets
slowly begin to drink fluds." Barton said. To prevent heat associated ill-
nessess, avoid outdoor activities nessess, avoid outloor activies
from 11 a.m. untile p. because
these are the hottest hours of the day, drink more fluids than normal; and get plenty of rest.
