Boll Weevil Trapping Horse Accessories Company Helps Revital Program

| Plains Cotton Growers along with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service is participating in a boll weevil trapping program again this year. <br> This program allows cotton growers and consultants to purchase four traps, four poles, twenty pheromone and eight kill strips for a cost of $\$ 12$. <br> The producer or consultant will monitor trap catches and report to the local Extension Agent, who will in turn summarize the information. <br> This program will allow us to "take the temperature" of the weevil situation across the area which will in turn help the control program get a better grasp of the kind of control effort that will be necessary in the fall if the boll weevil eradication referendum passes. Traps will also help producers and consultants determine if fields will benefit from an overwintered weevil insecticide application. <br> Traps can be ordered through the Brisco County Extension office. The deadline for placement of orders is April 11th. The Extension office phone number is 823-2131. |
