Recognizing which relationships really have the quality and depth of involvement is important, and it leads to the discovery that only in a few cases do people care about the well-being of someone.

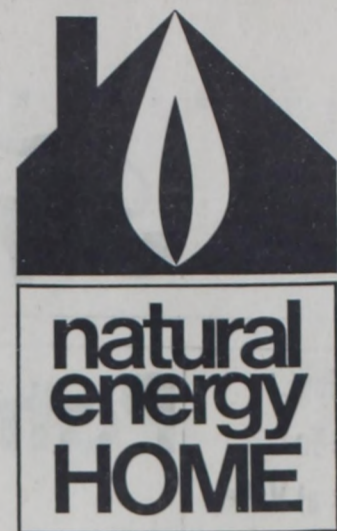
