## "Line Car"

Some people still remember when Turkey had a passenger bus from east to west each day. During this time the roads were kept in pretty good shape and the buses could get through during the rain storms and muddy roads,
In the early years and long before the time of the buses, the passengers were hauled through and from Turkey in a car
which was called a line car. The reason it was called a line car was because the roads were all on the section lines and did not go across peoples land like they do now. If you bought a theket from Turkey to Quitaque it was a fifteen mile fare for the line car had to travel fifteen miles to get there. The line ca driver would stop and put up the side curtains and this would keep the passengers dry except during a hail storm. This happened one time out between Turkey and Estelline and almost beat the top off the line car, but no one was badly hurt. Going by section lines it was fifty miles to Estelline. thi
frieght wagons would make deep ruts in the roads and this would make it difficult for the cars to get through but the freigh wagon drivers would often use teams of horses to pull them through the worst mud holes. Turkey had only one throug road and that was the only from Estelline through Turkey to Quitaque, then you go from there up the Lockney cap or up the sometimes people would have to get out and push. After you got out on the plains the roads were good except during rains and this meant trouble for everyone. The line car driver would stop in front of a drug store and pick up the passengers and you di not have to have a
