Cotton Referendum Vote Very Light In Briscoe County

During the first week in De cember, Briscoe County cotton farmers voted in a referendum conducted by USDA to deter-mine if marketing quotas would be in effect for 1970. Of course, in reality farmers were also vot-ing for or against the whole cot. ton program because if the referendum had not carried. then there would be no direct pay ments and only cotton loans at 65 percent of parity. All of this would represent a significant drop in farm income for this county. With these important considerations hanging in th balance, one would expect that cotton farmers would vote in record numbers, but such was not the case again this year. the case


