A pesticide safety training for agriculture workers and pes- ticide handlers will be held in conjunction with the Spring

Ag worker is anyone employed for any type of compensation and performs tasks related to the production of agricultural
plants. This includes harvest ing, weeding, and watering

All agricultural producers are farm employees are properly trained. All producers are strongly encouraged to bring their farm employees to the training in order to meet WPS regulations.
