The analysis of census
data for the City of Turkey
shows the low/mod income
percentage as 55.23 , so the
City is eligible to apply;
however, in order to receive
the highest possible score and
the best chance of getting
funded, the City needs to take
an additional step. Though
the census-based method is a
valid means of deriving this
income percentage, it tends to
overestimate the actual
numbers. So TDHCA allows
for applicant communities to
conduct their own surveys to
detemine this percentage.
This method is more entailed
but is much more accurate.
This method involves a brief
survey, taken door-to-door, of
all the households in Turkey.
The survey includes nine
questions and takes about two
to threeminutesto complete.
If the City can show that the
beneficiaries of the project
would be over 60 percent low to
moderate income, then the
application will automat-
ically receive 40 additional
points.

should also limit eggs in your diet.

whites contain no cholesterol.

bake, broil, roast, poach or braise instead of frying to reduce the fat.

containing fat to meats. Fresh, frozen or canned fruits

cholesterol and are almost always

You should however, avoid any wou should however, avoid sugar or fat

milk rather than $2 \%$ and whole milk are much healthier choices to make from the dairy group.
