

The minor leagues are not developing this type o pitchers any more because the "spit ganizations, and young pitchers know they have no future in the major leagues if they stick to freak deliveries

There is a growing sentiment among big league club owners, however, against casting out all "spitball" pitchers next season. Every American league club has at least one of thes epitchers and the National league harbors several. one season is therefore considered an unnecessary sacrifice of property rights.

Strict enforcement of the rules against "shine ball" pitching and the "doctor ing" of baseballs have hampered pitch ers to such an extent that batters are the featured performers this season. Even the arrival of hot weather has not appreciably decreased the hitting or improved the pitching. It is actually a relief to see a "spitballer" bob up now and then to curb the wielders of mighty


