

CONTRACT AWARDED FOR CISCO FEDERAL BUILDING TO WIGHITA, KAN., FIRM

Underhill Construction Co., of Wichita, Kan., has been awarded the contract to erect the Cisco federal building, according to a press dispatch from Washington, which stated that the treasury department had awarded the contract to this firm for \$75,000.

A letter from the contracting firm to Secretary Spencer, of the chamber of commerce, states that construction will begin early in January, and local labor will be employed except certain classes of skilled lobor. The building is to be complete in 360 working days, which will probably bea bout Christmas, 1933.
