I am told that the constitution also prohibits the city from giving anything away that belongs to the taxpayers of the city. There is no consideration for the contract, and it is unfair in half a dozen ways.

> We admit that what we don't know about the gas business would fill several volumes. But we know enough to know that this city is most favorably situated for securing her own gasmuch more favorable than many other places we might mention who have rebelled against the high rates, established municipal ownership for gas and lights and found it most satisfactory and remunerative - with rates far lower than those which had been paid the utility companies. We know enough about gas to mediate viciniy which have been steadily producing for yearsand the supply seems rather "dependable" for some time to come. We know that there are good citzens in the Cisco territory who have what appears to be a very 'dependable supply' of gas for which they have no market, and which could be bought at a most reasonable price. We know that there are companies which probably would be glad to contract to furnish gas at a cheaper rate if the city does not care to engage in the business.

Lots of Eastland County gas contains five or six gallons of gasoline per 1000 feet. This the Lone Star Gas Company extracts from the gas before offering it for sale at the city gates to the utility company. Say they get 8 cents per gallon for this gasoline, five times 8c makes 40 cents in gasoline and 44 cents from the gas at the city gates, makes 84 cents per thousand; and as their old boom times contract is the only one costing them 6 cents per thousand feet at the well we estimate 4 cents at the wall a fair average price. There is lots of it selling at 3 cents. Now from this total of 84 cents per thousand feet from gas and gasoline subtract the 4 cent cost. Four from 84 leaves 80 cents profit margin - but they claim they are losing

Texas for many years must rely for support on what nature stored under the soil and what can be produced from the soil. Its subsoil wealth should be safeguarded and the chief benefits derived from it should go to its citizens, not to exploiters from without the State.
