U. S. HAS SEVEN AUTOS TO GREAT BRITAIN'S ONE

International News Service. LONDON, June 28.—There is one motor car to every 12 persons in the population of Great Britain, in comparison with one car to every sixteen persons in the United States. This is the estimate of Sir H. P. Maybury, director of the roads departments of the ministry of transportation.

According to the estimates furnished by Sir H. P. Maybury there are 750,000 mechanically propelled vehicles in Great Britain, as against 6,148,117 in the United States, according to a census made recently.

It is not stated if these figures include motorcycles, but if they do it greatly decreases the number of motor cars in Great Britain, as there are a large number of motorcycles in use here.

MANY SHOP MEN RETURN; END OF STRIKE IS NEAR

BUSINESS IN THE MIDDLE WEST.

Every informed person knows that the eastern banks have "tightened up" on loans, and that this would naturally account for straitened conditions in money matters all over the country. This also would affect the mercantile business. "Reduction sales" have been put on in all parts of the country. Many staple articles can now be had at less expense than heretofore within the past two years. And yet there is less money to buy with than heretofore. In many items, prices are lower, but in all cases the lower-priced stuff is harder to get. And then, in the main, creditors are more insistent upon collections and less willing to wait or extend credit.

Now and then, in some parts of the country, a person of the debtor class gets into such distress that he is forced to sell his stuff for whatever he can get, and thereby lose his earnings for the past several years, thus tumbling back to the bottom of the ladder which he has been laboriously climbing for a long time, and being forced to start again from the ground at the very time when all conditions are against him. This may occur at the very time in life when he is most poorly equipped to renew the struggle for existence. The aged merchant who has built up a large trade, but has unwisely let out a great deal of stuff on a credit, stands agape watching his goods sold under the hammer. He realizes, not only that his business is gone, but also that he now has no rating and no credit in the business world. He never needed financial friends so much, and never had so few.

The farmer who bought his place on a credit, has paid all debts thereon except about one-fourth the purchase price, not able to pay the rest one-fourth, looks with distress upon the foreclosure proceedings by which his home and farms slip away from him. He may have spent many years, much hard labor, and hard-earned money on this home, making it worth double the purchase price, but he loses it, all the same. It may be he is now advanced in years and broken in health, and certainly in poor plight to suffer such loss.

Moreover, to begin now as a tenant, to renew the struggle for existence, is almost a hopeless task.

It is a cheerful fact that Middle West Texas, of which Cisco is the center, is practically free from such conditions as are named in the foregoing remarks. While business is "quiet everywhere," our territory is in good condition financially. There is plenty of money in the country, although the banks are discouraging wild-cat speculations.

The Middle West can stand the pressure. It has passed through many worse ordeals, and has always come out without serious, permanent hurt. Through all these years, moreover, the population has been increasing, and investments have netted large returns. And right now is a good time to invest money in the Middle West, and most specially in Cisco and contiguous territory.—A. E. Baten.

### ESTATE OF DEAD MAN SUCED FOR HEART BALM

International News Service. GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., June 28.—The \$25,000 claim in probate court here of Marion Desmond of New York City against the estate of Walter T. Tate, based on an alleged breach of promise to marry, will be contested by the heirs of the estate, it is announced.

On Tate's promise to marry, Miss Desmond asserts, she sold her business in New York City at a loss of \$10,000. She asks an additional \$15,000 because of certain alleged concessions on her part after she says she received the proposal of marriage. She asks \$500 to refund her railroad fare, a part of which was spent, she explains, in a trip from New York to Washington to marry Tate. His estate amounts to \$30,000.


