Gas Lights Not New To Clyde Sisters Who Have Used Them Since 1918

Susan and Ruby Barr of Clyde, Texas are surprised at "all the fuss" being made about gas lights. The reason is they've never used anything else.

"We're scared of it," they say in explaining why they have never had their house wired for electricity. "When we visit our sister here in town, we're afraid to even push a button," they said while bustling around in their kitchen making lunch.

Mantles Hard to Find
The Barr sisters were born in Lockport, Kansas. They came to Texas with their father in December, 1882, and settled in Hunt County. They moved into their present house in Clyde in November, 1904. "Our father put gas into the house in 1918 and we've never seen any reason to change. We like gas and like the service we get from the gas company people. Besides, our gas bill is not enough to worry about."

They lived with their father, J. A. Barr, until he died in 1926. The only problem the sisters have is getting replacements for their two gas lights. The mantles must be ordered from Sunshine Mantle Company of Chanute, Kansas.

Besides the two lights, the sisters have a Servel gas refrigerator, Garland range, and three space heaters. They heat their water on the range since they don't have a water heater yet.

During the day the active ladies quilt for friends and relatives and Miss Susan teaches phonics to school children. The sisters also serve as baby-sitters for the children of their nephews and nieces and other friends. Both ladies like to read. "We read our Bibles every day and we like to keep up with the news in the daily newspapers. We like to read political news in the papers and books about foreign countries."

"We don't know how to adjust the gas lights properly but they give out enough light to brighten up the room and enough that we can read by them." They have one light in their bedroom and one in the kitchen.

"And we talk to our friends and relatives on the telephone. One of our nephews put the telephone in for us recently." From Lone Star Gas Co's. "Blue Blaze."
