





# LOUVRE CASTS OUT NEW DATA ON MONA LISA

PARIS, July 9.—Dr. Henri Verne, director of the world-famous Louvre Museum, challenges American Professor Raymond S. Stites' identification of Leonardo da Vinci's mysterious "Mona Lisa" as Isabella d'Este, Marchioness of Mantua.

In an interview, Dr. Verne declared Louvre experts are still convinced that the model who posed for the enigmatic portrait was Lisa Gheradine, third wife of the Florentine patrician Francesco di Zanobi del Giocondo.

"There is documentary evidence that Da Vinci worked on the portrait of Giocondo's wife for four years, beginning in 1501, because he called in musicians to play and buffoons to crack jokes during the hours of posing," explained Dr. Verne.

**Strange Smile Captured**  
"The soft music and the jests were to amuse her as she sat before the easel. It was in this way that the great master succeeded in capturing on canvas that strange smile which still haunts and enchants the world. Naturally, this novel method of producing prolonged smiles was the subject of much comment at the time."

Referring to the newspaper accounts regarding the contention of Dr. Stites, professor at Antioch college, Ohio, Dr. Verne said:  
"I do not see anything new in these articles to convince me that 'Mona Lisa' was not Lisa Gheradine. But I cannot be so unscientific as to say absolutely he has not been able to throw new light on the subject."

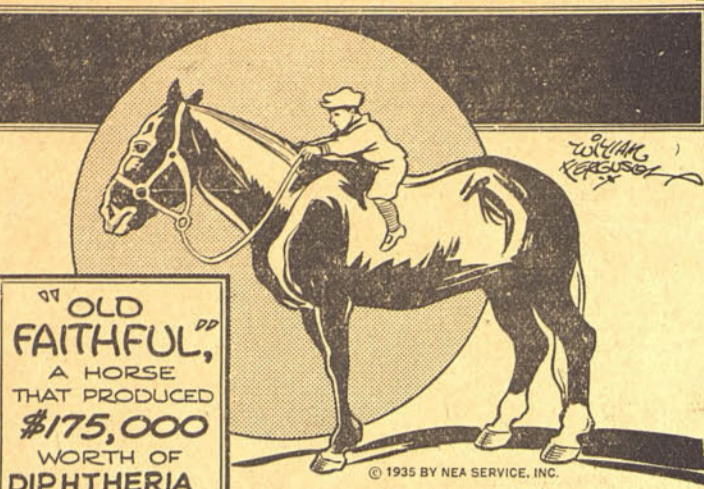
"But until we, ourselves, here at the Louvre, can carefully examine this documentation we must continue to regard 'Mona Lisa' as Lisa Gheradine, born in 1479 and married in 1495 to Francesco di Zanobi del Giocondo. Incidentally, she was the Florentine and not from Naples as sometimes contended."

**Painted For Pleasure**  
The director then produced books from the archives of the Louvre to show that the portrait had not been ordered by her husband, but had been painted by Leonardo simply for his own pleasure. He also brought forth a copy of a portrait which Leonardo had done of Isabella d'Este to point out the differences between the two models.

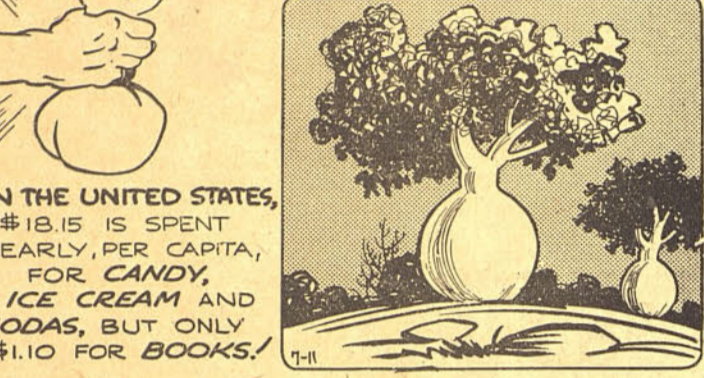
Asked about the history of the "Mona Lisa" painting, which was stolen from the Louvre Museum in 1911 and recovered in 1913, Dr. Verne said:

"Our records show it was probably brought to France when Leonardo went to live at Cloux. Fran-

cis I bought it for 4,000 gold eus. The canvas passed the 16th and 17th centuries at Fontainebleau and the 18th at Versailles.

"In 1800, Napoleon Bonaparte had it placed in his bedroom in the Tuileries, but in 1804 he had it removed to the Louvre, where it has remained ever since except between 1911 and 1913."

## Diver Will Hunt Ship of LaSalle

MENOMINEE, Mich., July 8.—Efforts to identify the water-soaked hulk in Les Cheneaux island waters, believed to be that of the Griffon, first sailing ship to play the Great Lakes which mysteriously disappeared in 1679, will be resumed this summer.

John Beattie, veteran diver of DeTour, Mich., has offered his services free in an attempt to learn more of the Griffon, built by the French explorer La Salle 256 years ago.

The ship last was seen at the site of the present Detroit harbor, Washington Island, Green Bay, where it was loaded with valuable furs. La Salle sent the ship on its return voyage under the command of Luc, a sailor. The explorer remained to probe into the secrets of the "strange" surrounding country.

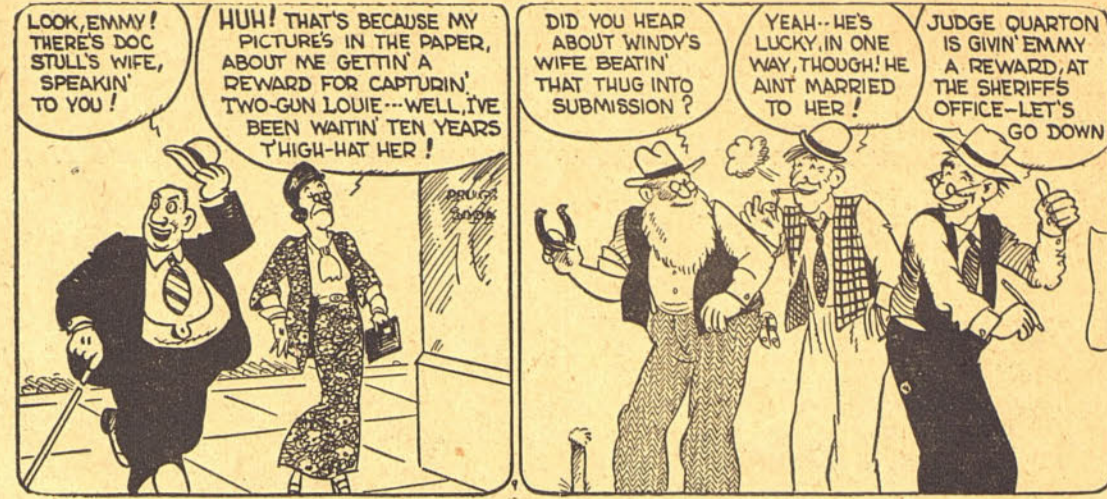
In letters to friends after the ship was never seen again, La Salle expressed the belief that Luc betrayed him, stole the furs, and scuttled and burned the ship. Some historians, however, believe the ship sank in a storm, carrying all hands down with it.

Efforts to raise the hulk in Les Cheneaux waters were abandoned in the winter of 1933-34 because of financial difficulties. It was found that a large hole had been made in the bottom near the stern and that the upper part of the craft had been burned.

By COWAN. Soviet To Honor Death of Tolstoy



MOSCOW, July 9 — Active preparations are under way here by the literary and art organizations of the Soviet Union in connection with the forthcoming 25th anniversary of the death of Leo Tolstoy, Nov. 20.

Plans are being carried out throughout the Soviet Union, and particularly near the town of Tula, where Tolstoy spent the greater part of his life. Usually about 20,000 persons visit this area annually, but it is expected that number will be increased greatly by the forthcoming anniversary.

The Tolstoy museum in Moscow is opening an exhibition dedicated to the writer's life, beginning with 1860. A jubilee collection of unpublished material about Tolstoy will be published.

Extensive restoration work is being carried out in the "House of Leo Tolstoy" in Moscow. A book by N. Gusev, "The Life and Work of Leo Tolstoy" is being published. It includes short extracts from the diaries and letters of the writer. It will be translated into European languages.

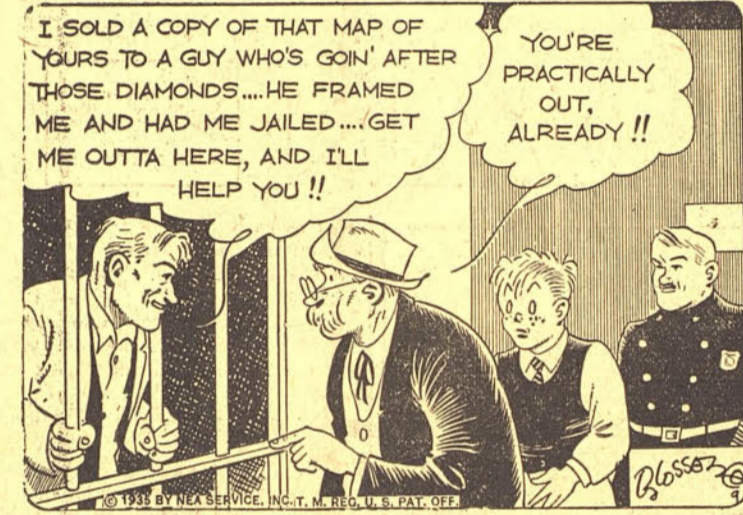
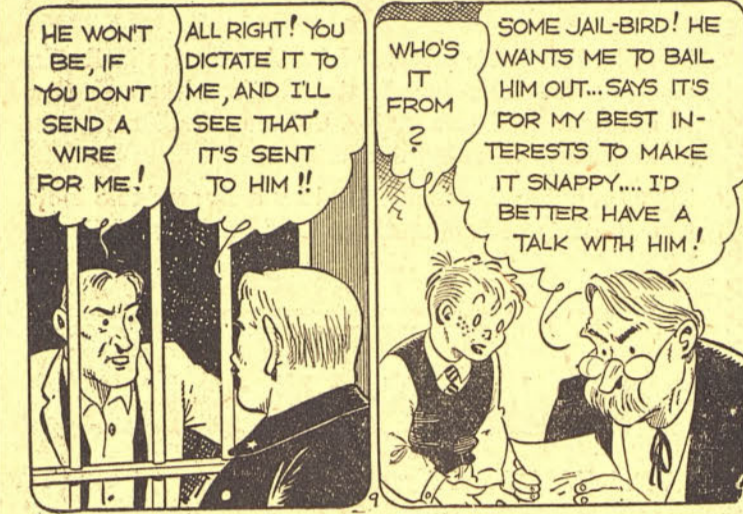
