MAYOR CHALLENGES WILD TO PROVE CHARGES IN MASS MEETING ON MONDAY NIGHT

Mayor James Williamson has openly challenged Claud Wild, former city commissioner, to prove at a mass meeting held at the city hall auditorium this Monday evening, charges which Wild made regarding the municipal administration's alleged procrastination and retroactivity.

A petition is being circulated on the streets of Cisco asking for the recall of Mayor Williamson on the charge of being responsible for "certain deplorable conditions" which are alleged to obtain in

A counter-petition is also being circulated by the mayor's sponsors, asking for definite charges against the mayor and for a mass meeting Monday night for public consideration of the controversy, and at which the mayor will answer his accusers.

These are the latest developments in the fight which ensued when the smouldering embers of dissension in the city commission broke into flames at its most recent meeting, with the resignations of Commissioners Wild and Sue.

The mass meeting at the auditorium has been called for eight o'clock. Attorney B. W. Patterson, chairman of the Law and Order League, has been asked to preside at the mass meeting.
