Two Die, One Injured In Eastland County Head On Crash Wednesday

The driver of a 2009 Chevrolet Impala, Harry B. Garvin, 71 years of age from Cisco, and Peter Simas, 53 years of age from Cisco, passenger in a 1989 GMC pickup, died from injuries in a head on crash Thursday, November 25 occurring at 10:06 A.M. in Eastland County on U. S. Highway 183 near mile post 334. The driver of the GMC pickup, Russell D. Brown, 55 years of age from Cisco, Texas was injured. The GMC pickup was towing a trailer.

Harry Garvin was pronounced dead at 10:45 A.M. at the scene by Justice of

the Peace, D. J. Walker. The body was transported to Kimbrough Funeral Home in Cisco. Garvin was wearing his seat belt.

Peter Simas was pronounced dead at 11:37 A.M. at Hendrick Medical Center by Judge Smith. Simas was wearing his seat belt. Russell Brown was taken to Hendrick Medical Center where he was listed as stable with blunt trauma. He was wearing his seat belt.

The Chevrolet Impala, driven by Garvin was traveling south on US 183. The

GMC pickup with trailer, driven by Brown was traveling North on the same highway. The pickup traveled across the highway, into the path of the Impala. The vehicles collided head on. The road was dry and weather clear.

This crash is investigated by Trooper Shawn Lewis of Eastland.

Commissioners Discuss Fencing Along County Roads

The adoption of a policy concerning fencing along county roads and rights of way was discussed and considered at the County Commissioners November 23, 2009 regular meeting.

To begin the discussion, it was noted that Commissioner Bill Underwood, Precinct 3, has had issues with a landowner building a new fence along an area which could interfere with the maintenance of a county road. All commissioners expressed similar problems and expressed the opinion that the county should have a policy regarding fencing.

As neighboring Callahan County has a policy in place (8 ft. from bottom of road ditch), Callahan County Judge, Rodger Corn, sent a

copy of the policy for the Eastland County Commissioners to look over. The Callahan County policy was discussed as well as how to best word a policy for Eastland County. This item was tabled and will be placed on the Dec. 14 meeting after the right wording is found and the Court's legal advisor, District Attorney Russ Thomason, has looked over the policy.

Memorandums of understanding (without changes) were adopted and signed at the November 23 commissioner's meeting with the City of Cisco (Cisco Fire Department), and the Rising Star Volunteer Fire Department. The first quarterly payment of funds allocated to these fire departments by

the County will also be sent. Memorandums of understanding were adopted and signed with fire departments of Desdemona, Ranger, and Gorman at the November 9, 2009 meeting.

In addition, Commissioners declared an old refrigerator and microwave from the County Clerk's Office as salvage and allowed the donation of the above to the Eastland County 4H organization.

Expenditure of funds for two cabinet files from the County Clerks Record Management Fund was approved. Commissioners also approved executing contracts with or through Netdate to use credit cards for County Court payments (criminal and probate payments).

There was no 911 update at the meeting. The County Burn Ban was left off.

In the Cooperative Dispatch update, Judge Fields said he had reports of communication working a lot better with the new phones. County Sheriff, Wayne Bradford, agreed.

In personnel matters, Commissioner Wayne Honea, Precinct 1, was give permission to advertise to hire a temporary full time employee.

Commissioners certified additional funds from the FEMA Grants Fund to Road

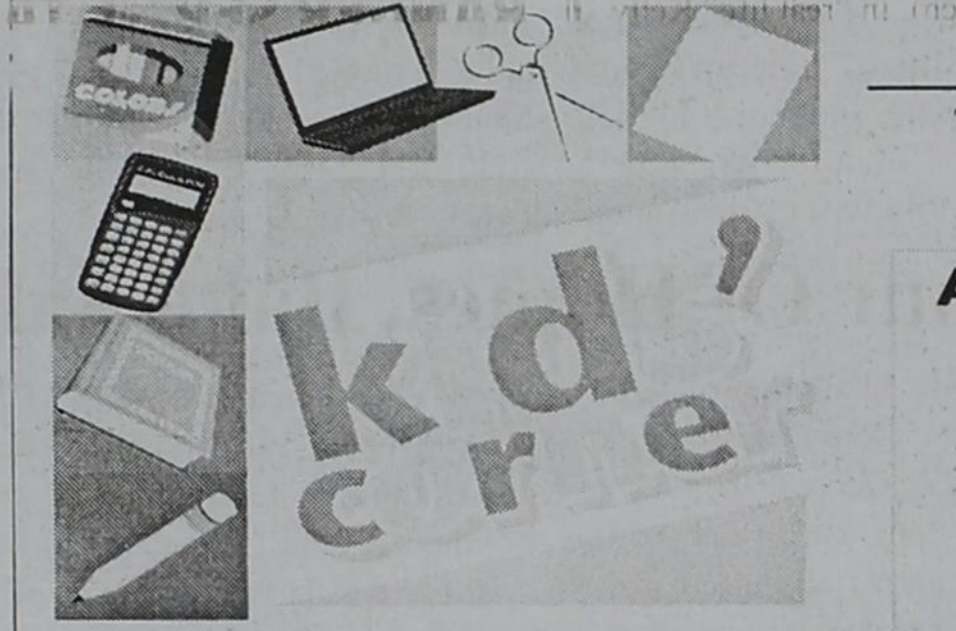

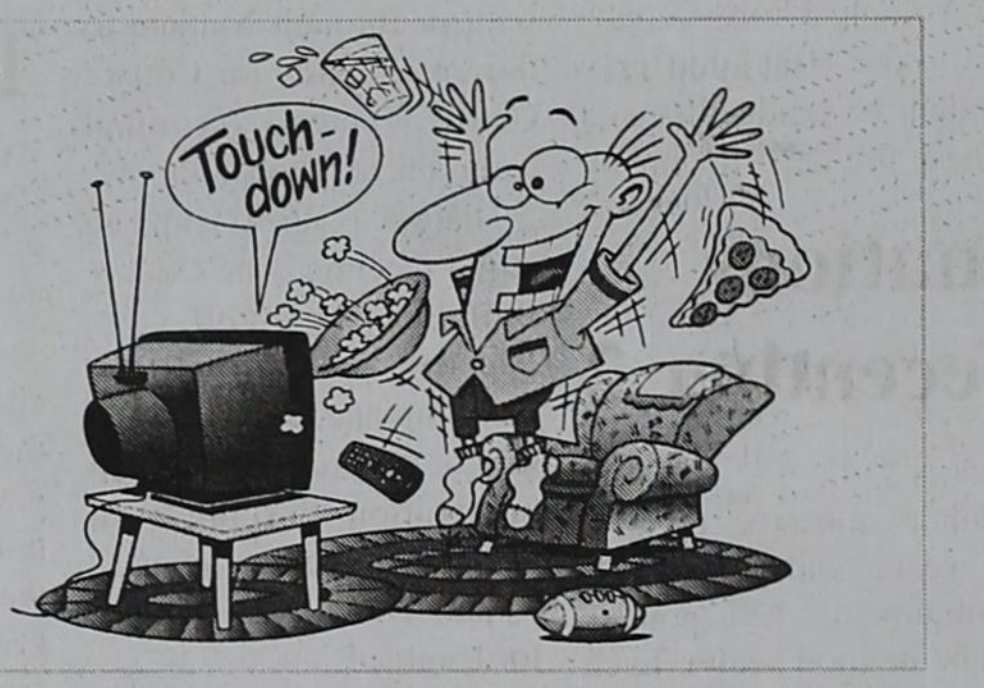

Changing "Seasons" Of Life May Require Changes In Investment Strategy

As we make the transition from autumn to winter, you may be reminded that seasons don't just change on the calendar—they also change in your life. And as you move from one season of your life to another, you'll find that some of your goals may have changed. Consequently, as time goes by, you may need to adjust your financial strategies as well.

To illustrate the "seasonal" nature of your investment strategies, let's quickly go through a typical life cycle and look at the differing financial goals at each stage:

Starting out--When you are beginning your career, you may not have a lot of money with which to invest, but it's important to try to put away something each month. If you have a 401(k) where you work, take advantage of it--your money is deducted, pretax, from your paychecks, so it's an easy way to start investing. And at this stage of your life, consider investing primarily for growth. Of course, when you invest in growth-oriented vehicles, you typically assume an above-average degree of risk because the price of these investments can fluctuate greatly over time. However, if you buy quality investments and hold them for many years, you may be able to overcome the "blips" along the way and benefit from the growth prospects these vehicles can offer.

Middle years--During this season of your life, things have likely changed. Your kids may have already graduated from college or otherwise left home, so you may need to re-evaluate your life insurance needs. You're likely earning more money and have more available to invest--which means, among other things, that you should consider "maxing out" on your IRA and also putting as much as you afford into your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan. Furthermore, you'll want to manage the withdrawals you take from your IRA, 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan to help make sure you don't

outlive your resources. At the same time, you should consider exploring estate-planning techniques, such as life insurance trusts, that can help you leave the legacy you want without burdening your heirs with heavy estate taxes. To help you meet these needs, work with your tax advisor and estate-planning professional.

The seasons of the year change every three months. The seasons of your life change much more slowly, but these changes can have a big impact on your financial situation.

Having lived in Eastland in the 1940's I have enjoyed receiving your newspaper these past several months.

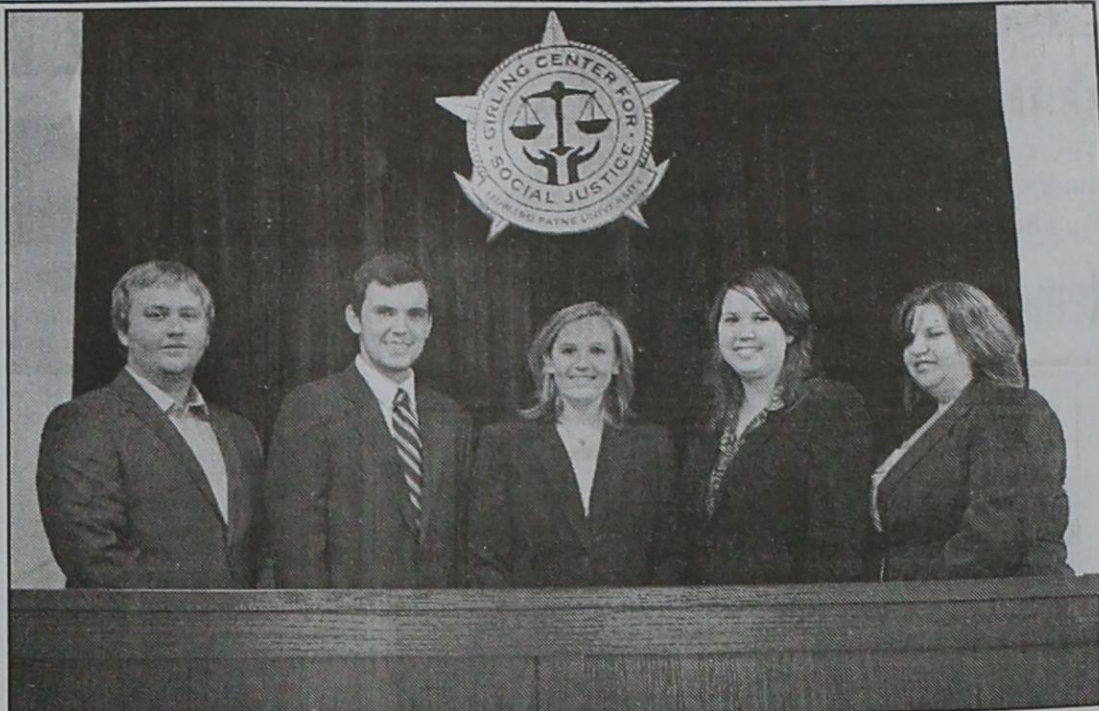
My wife receives her hometown newspaper, The Cassville Democrat, published in Cassville, Mo. There is a feature in her paper that lifts hillites from the past.

BROWNWOOD – November 23, 2009 – The Howard Payne University Moot Court team of Cara Brewer and Lauren Teel took

second place at the at Texas Undergraduate Moot Court Association Southwest Regional Championship on November 6 and 7. As finalists in the competition, Brewer and Teel were able to argue their case in front of former U.S. Attorney General, Alberto Gonzales.

Issues to Address Inside Your Current Estate Plan Part I

Because the future of the estate tax rates, the estate tax exemption amount, and the 'step up' basis is currently up in the air, the only planning that can be done now should be based on current rates and regulations. But that doesn't mean to stop planning or maintaining your estate plan altogether - there are many important reasons you should take a closer look at your current estate plan now.

Over the next two weeks, I would like to cover the most common issues inside an existing estate plan that need to be addressed. I strongly encourage you to review your legal documents and discuss these issues with your Life Planner and attorney.

1. As you may have read in one of our past articles: "legal documents are not just for dying." Some of the most essential documents are designed to protect you in the event that you become incapacitated: If incapacity were to occur, your designated medical power of attorney could make medical decisions for you, a succes-

or trustee could manage the assets inside your living trust and a general or durable power of attorney could handle those assets outside your trust. By the way...did you know that your spouse cannot even obtain any right of power over any assets that are not in her/his name without a power of attorney or court order - which could take weeks or even months?

But what I want you to consider today is: according to your legal documents, how easy is it to determine whether or not you are incapacitated? In the past, many legal documents required written certifications from two licensed physicians to determine incapacity. A little known fact is that this can be very difficult to obtain and time consuming, when time may be crucial. One idea is to have your documents state that incapacity be determined by the attending physician and a loved one, or perhaps by an attending physician alone if you feel that your loved ones would be unable to make this type of decision.

2. On August 21, 1996, President Bill Clinton signed the Health Insurance Portability & Accountability

Act (HIPAA) into law. This act protects the medical privacy of any patient, which means that without an actual HIPAA authorization your designated medical power of attorney cannot obtain the medical information they may need to make informed medical decisions on your behalf.

3. As stated before, there are many pieces of legislation concerning estate planning that are still up in the air for upcoming years, making awareness of this next issue may be more critical than ever before: If you become incapacitated and your estate exceeds the applicable exclusion amount triggering federal estate tax, do your legal documents allow for someone to act on your behalf in order to implement the necessary planning tools and steps to reposition or reduce the size of your estate?

4. If you haven't already, I encourage you to visit our online learning center at www.kennedy-financial.com and read "What Will the Holidays Be Like After You Are Gone?" It has been somewhat traditional to name a loved one or loved

ones to act as trustees or successor trustees, and powers of attorney to handle financial matters. Yet the duties that must be performed by these appointments often take place while dealing with medical emergencies or complications, or they involve decisions beyond the appointee's experience or abilities. I encourage you to speak with your Life Planner about utilizing an unrelated entity or individual that can either fill this role or share this role with a love one to ease the potential angst.

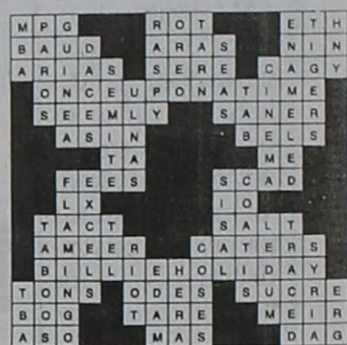
5. It is not uncommon to think your assets are protected if they are positioned in a living trust—but this simply isn't true. The issue of asset protection is especially critical to business owners who are susceptible to lawsuits, but it should be addressed by anyone who has a substantial amount of assets. For example: if you or someone in your family is in a multi-car accident and becomes disabled or has killed another individual. After their family's attorney performed a fact find; what could they sue you for? What assets do you have that they could get to? Think your insurance will cover that? Think

again. Planning in order to address asset protection is unique to almost every situation so don't overlook this one... and get help.

Estate planning is extremely complicated and it is impossible to touch on every related issue in just a few articles, much less go into enough detail for each family's unique situation. Next week, we'll focus on the most common issues that need to be addressed inside existing trust plans. Local Men Credited For Blood Donations

There are many ways of celebrating a birthday. But for Fred Tucker of Eastland, his 70th birthday - November 12, 2009 - will certainly stand out as a special day. As of that date, he was credited for donating 53.6 gallons of blood.

Fred Tucker started regularly donating in 1973, he said. "I had donated blood from time to time when someone needed blood, starting back in the '60's. In 1973 a man in our church was in need of blood. Other members of the church and I went to Meek Blood Center to donate for him. I picked up a brochure describing the need for blood for those ill or injured, and decided this was something that I could do that would be good for someone else and make me feel good for doing something good for someone that would probably never know that I did it."

Fred Tucker not only donates whole blood, but for the most part, his remaining donation is platelets - the clotting component in blood. This process is called apheresis. Platelet donors are a lifeline to cancer patients undergoing chemotherapy treatment.

"I would like to encourage everyone who is able to donate every chance they have, be it on a regular basis or just once in a while. The holidays are critical times for blood centers as there are usually

more accidents and donors are sometimes busy and don't take the time to give," Fred Tucker added.

Another platelets donor is Ray Rodgers of Morton Valley. He has been donating platelets for about a year and has been credited with over five gallons.

"Ray and I donate at Meek Blood Center which is part of the Hendrick Medical System," Fred Tucker said. They encourage those who can't travel to give, to watch for the mobile blood motor home and give when it is in this area. One must travel to a blood center to donate platelets, however. "Give blood," Fred Tucker continued. "You will be blessed, and you can save a life." Fred Tucker is a retired teacher. He was born and raised in Eastland, was away for 13 years and moved from Grapevine back to Eastland County in 1973. He taught school in Columbus, GA, Decatur, TX, Grapevine, TX, Breckenridge, Carbon and DeLeon. Fred and his wife Jackie lived at Flatwood for 32 years, but moved to Eastland about 5 years ago. Ray Rodgers was raised and went to school in Olden. He is a retired Baptist preacher and married to the former Mickey Lowrance.

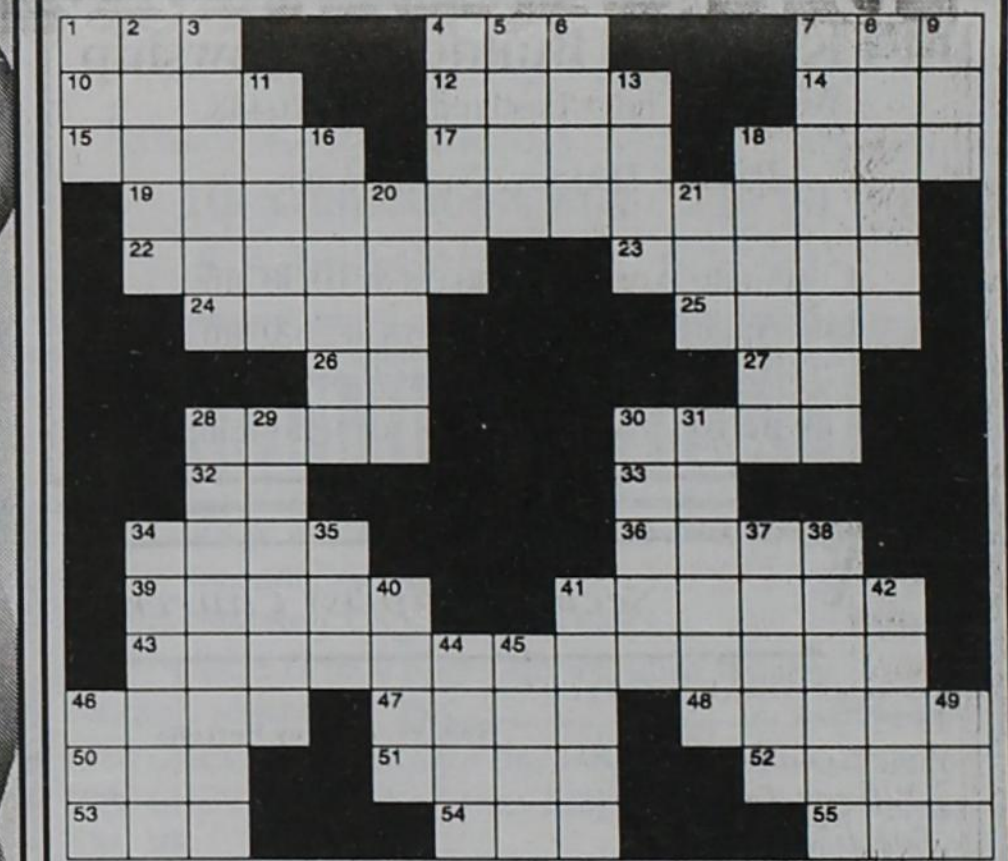

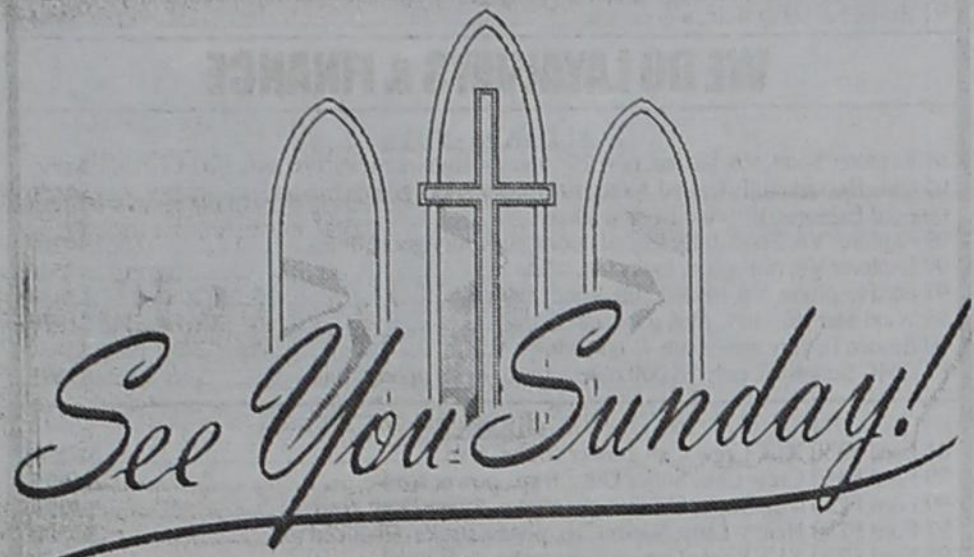

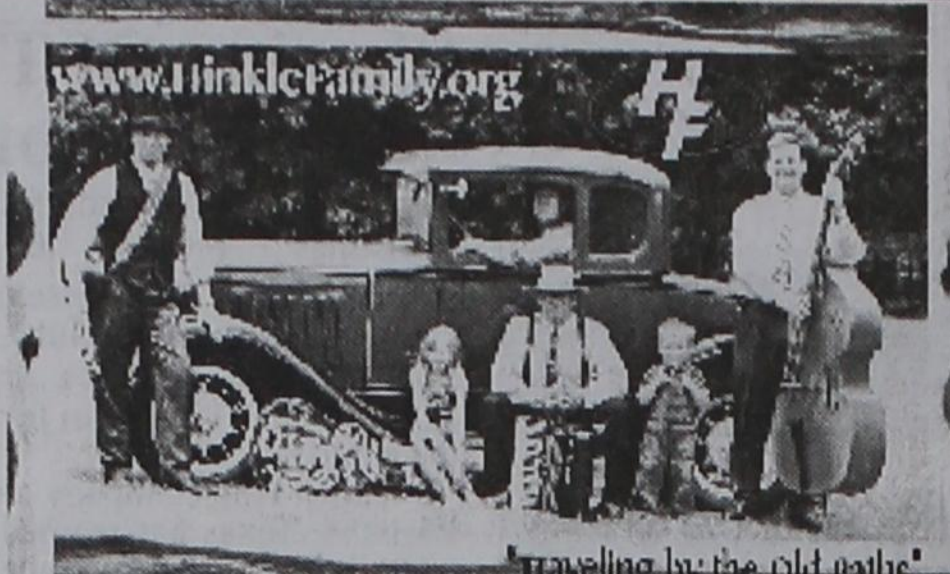

Jesus explained that our Heavenly Father feeds them and cares for them. He added that we are of more value than they. By the way, have you ever seen a skinny sparrow?

Jesus also said that God even clothes the grass of the field. In the midst of all our worries and fears it makes you wonder if our Creator really cares about His creation. I believe He does. It makes you wonder if He is serious about answering our prayers. I believe He is. It makes you wonder if He can still do miracles and intervene when

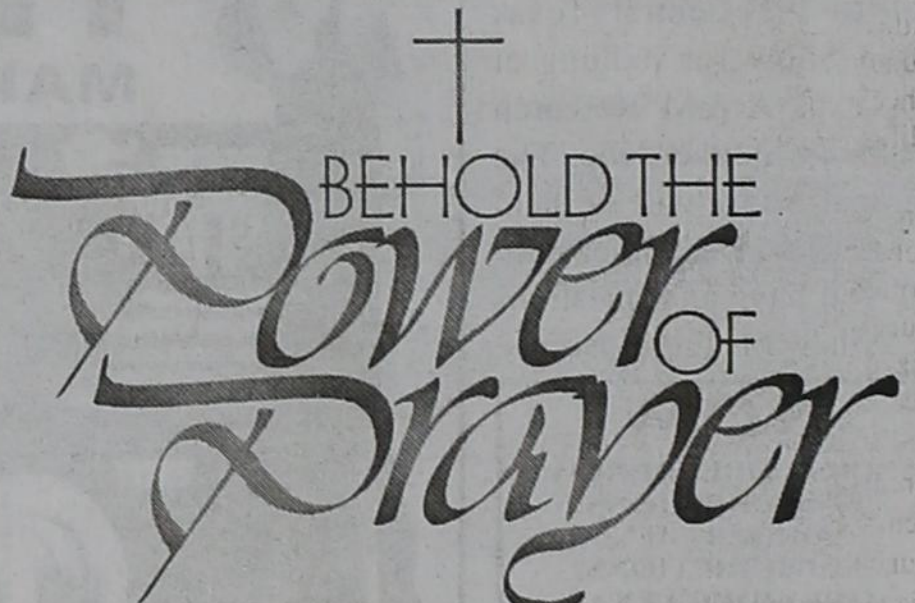
we need help. He has never stopped.

Jesus was very clear in trying to tell us something that seems to escape our thoughts all too often. We need to focus on Him.
