

Across The Snowbelt, Dog Sledding Returns As Competitive Sport

With a pro-am circuit of more than 400 races, some with purses of more than \$10,000, the competitive sport of dog sledding has made a "rousing comeback," according to the current issue of National Wildlife magazine. Thanks to the snowmobile, it may not be the popular means of transportation it once was, but from New England right across the snowbelt to California and up to Alaska, dogsledding races attract huge crowds each winter.

The colorful races range from a looping 13-mile course at the annual Sierra Sweepstakes in Truckee, Cal., to a 1,150-mile Alaskan marathon, says National Wildlife Federation's bimonthly publication. At the All-American Sled-Dog Championships in Ely, Minn., prize money now exceeds \$10,000, most of it raised from flea markets and bake sales.

Dogs used for sledding - called "mush puppies" - are very strong and easily able to survive in cold and snow. They have big, broad paws which act like built-on snowshoes. Tufts of hair which grow between their toes guard against ice slivers. They also have two coats of fur - a thick undercoat which is warm and soft, like thermal underwear, and a longer, heavier oily topcoat which helps keep them dry.

Some sled drivers, or "mushers," like big, sturdy Malamutes, which are strong enough to pull a sled all day. Others prefer lively Samoyeds or Eskimo dogs. One of the most popular species of sled dogs is the Siberian husky, which is lighter than other mush puppies, but also faster. Huskies get along well as a team and make excellent pets.

Is dog sledding a lucrative sport? It can be for innkeepers and grocers in towns where races are held, says National Wildlife. "More than 7,000 spectators and participants may pile into one town on race weekend, not to mention 3,000 hungry dogs." However, most of today's sled drivers participate in racing as much for their dogs - mush puppies love to run - as for the money.

There are some earnest mushers who may make more than \$20,000 a season. But, as National Wildlife

If you're suffering from a fever, coughing, sore throat, runny nose, and generally just ache all over, guess what you have? January marks the beginning of the peak influenza season, so brace yourself to ward off or weather the attack says the Texas Medical Association (TMA).

Anyone can come down with the flu, especially if it is widespread in a community. It is more likely to be serious for those with chronic diseases, the aged or women who are pregnant.

The flu usually takes one to three days to develop. When it does come out into the open, you may notice chills, fever, headache, backache, muscular pains and a loss of appetite. Your temperature may go up quickly during and first day of symptoms, and will gradually drop over a few days. Fever usually lasts for about three days, but it may go on for as long as seven.

As your fever drops, you may notice more stiffness in your nose and the cough may continue. There might also be a pus in the discharges from your nose and throat. From that point on, however, you'll begin healing quickly.

While most patients recover completely within a week, many continue to feel unusually tired for some time. The standard remedies of getting plenty of rest, drinking fluids and taking aspirin still hold true says the TMA. Hot chicken soup coupled with tender loving care couldn't hurt either. In most cases, the flu leaves no permanent after effects, but occasionally, people do develop other illnesses. The most common complication is pneumonia. Other sicknesses that piggyback the flu are persistent cough or bronchitis, sinus trouble and ear infections.

B. Wright, Jr., advised city officials in a letter dated Dec. 22nd.

"The Petition should be rejected because the Petition states on the face that it is filed in compliance with Article 1164a-8, Vernon's Civil Statutes.

"Article 1164a-8, V.A.C.S., is one part of Chapter 12A, which includes Articles 1164a-1 through 1164a-10. According to Article 1164a-1, the cities referred to in Articles 1164a-1 through 1164a-10 are "any incorporated city... incorporated under the general laws...".

"The City of Cisco is a home-rule city, and not a general-law city. Therefore, Articles 1164a-1 through 1164a-10 are not applicable to the City of Cisco, and any petition filed under Article 1164a-8 is not applicable to the City of Cisco.

"The proper way to abandon the city manager plan of government would be to amend the charter, as provided in Article 1165, et seq. V.A.C.S. However, Article 1165 provides that cities having more than 5,000 inhabitants may amend their charters. It is my understanding that the latest federal census shows the City of Cisco has less than 5,000 people, and, because the power to amend flows from the fact of having 5,000 people, it is doubtful that the City may amend its charter until such time as it exceeds 5,000 inhabitants."

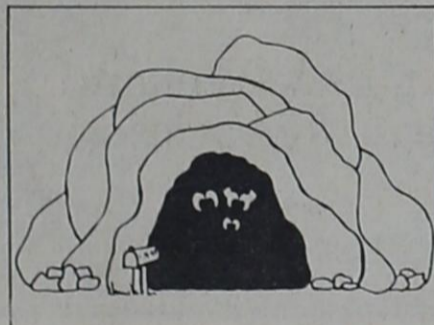

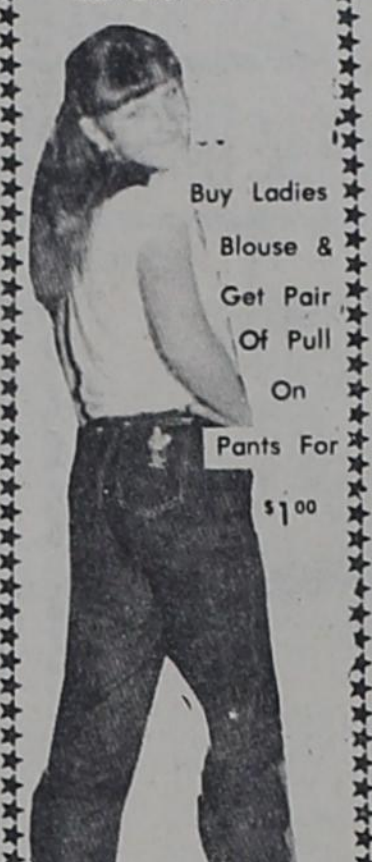
