The safety of those children is actually in your hands: they are absorbed, they are careless from their concentration on the moment, no telling when one of them may dart right out into your path. You, the adult motorist, must think for them when they're thoughtless, must see for them when they're looking the other way, must make your own alert attention take the place of their young distraction. . . . Slow down for children-it will give you a whole lot of satisfaction every time you do.




