## CONFERENCE FOUR ENGNEED BOMBERS SCORE DIRECT HITS ON THREE SHIPS; MARKS A

 CHAMGE NORTH AFRICA, May $15 .-$ American Flying Fortresses made a heavy attack on Citvitavecchia, Central Italian seaport 38 miles orthwest of Rome, and other bombers raided Sardinian bases, the Allied High Command an nounced today as the Allies pressed a series of hammering blows against the southern fringeAxis Europe
The four-engined bombers scored direct hits on several ships in the Civitavecchia harbor, on fuel storage' facilities and on an ammunition dump which exploded.

Medium bombers raided the Sardinian port of Albia, sinking three ships and seriously dam aging a large tanker and other ships. The docks and industrial area of the port were dam aged and three enemy aircraft destroyed.

Fighter bombers attacked northern Sar dinia, bombing the air field and port of Alghero and the harbor at Porto Torres. Railroad points in that area also were attacked. Well ington bombers made a heavy attack on the southern Sardinia port of Cagliari causing

At the same time, the communique pointed out that Allied naval forces in Tunisia waters had sunk 10 enemy ships, including an Italian destroyer, and numerous small craft between April 30 and May 12, when all chance of an Axis Dunkirk escape from Africa were broken up. At least 490 Axis soldiers attempting to e by sea were captured.
Admiral of the Fleet Sir Andrew Cunning ham, commander in the Mediterranean, con gratulated his forces for "good service" in per forming "a difficult and arduous job" that pre vented the enemy from making any "real ef
(The Italian report said Axis airplanes had bombed the Allied port of Bone sinking a tanker and that Allied planes had attacked Paler no, Sassari and other points in Sardinia.)
