The five persons were named in sealed indictments last June 27 after an investigation by Special Prosecutor Bill Hart, Eastland

Andrews and Peacock are sisters and the daughters of Perry. Hinton is Perry's brother-in-law.

Andrews was indicted in 1982 on a capital murder count but in December, 1983, four days before she was scheduled to go on trial, she pleaded no contest to a lesser charge of criminal conspiracy and was given a 10-year propated sentence.

statement saying she helped Charles LeFlore, convicted as the murderer of Mrs. Garcia, in escaping but she did not have a part in the killing. Bill Buckner, Andrew's attorney in the first case, told an interviewer that he does not understand how Andrews

can be indicted on a capital murder charge a second time after she had been convicted on the lesser charge. "I'm at loss to understand how this can be done in the Texas and American legal system," he said. He added that the U.S. constitution

prohibits people from being brought to trial twice on the same charge if a verdict already has been rendered. The concept is usually called double jeopardy, he said.

"Fit for Life" is a 12 week educational course which began this week and is being sponsored by the Eastland County Agricultural Extension Service. The Fit for Life concept is simple. It means eating nutritious meals and engaging in exercise.

The response throughout the county has been tremendous, and there is a waiting list of people wanting to enroll. The present class began August 20, and will finish November 5. Plans are underway to start additional classes in January following the holidays.

Research shows that a program of diet and exercise works in controlling weight but only if the program is permanently maintained.

During the next 12 weeks, the participants will go through five behavioral steps to make permanent diet and exercise changes. These steps include:

Self-monitoring - keeping activity logs and food

Changing the way we eat - eating more slowly, selecting low-calorie foods, modifying recipes, and portion

Stimulus control and alerting patterns-which means controlling eating cues, building activity into your day, managing stress and designing an individual exercise program.

Reinforcing lifestyle changes through personal

Developing a positive attitude and good self concept.

This huge attendance resulted from a three page color picture story being printed in the March 1970 edition of the Progressive Farmer Magazine with over five million copies going out nation wide just one month prior to the Easter dates.

In 1975, The Texas Highway Magazine sent two photographers and a writer to the Easter production to get a color picture story, and, as a result of these three seeing the pageant and returning to Austin and reporting to the tourist bureau of what they had seen, representatives from the Texas Tourist Bureau contacted the Kendrick Family and requested that the pageant be presented as a tourist attraction for the state, of which was considered by the family and cast and this year was the 10th summer the production has been performed each Thursday and Friday night' at 9 p.m. Many thousands have seen the summer presentations during these 10 years.

In 1980, an unannounced writer from the Texas Monthly Magazine attended a summer production of the

pageant. This writer travels the state for four years seeing everything there was to see, then wrote up his story of the 140 Best and Worst Things There Are To See In Texas. The Life of Christ Pageant was termed as the Best Outdoor Drama in the state in this article which was in the July 1980 edition of the magazine.
