### He didn't stand a chance

A burglar accused of stealing a pack of cigarettes, a lighter and candy from a car made one mistake: The vehicle was an unmarked police car — and the officer was watching from 15 feet away. Idaho Falls, Idaho, officer John Huston said he had been patrolling a parking lot on foot when he approached his car and saw a man getting out.

Huston said he watched as the man used a towel to wipe away fingerprints and then get into a nearby car and drive away. Huston followed the car and pulled the suspect over.

### \$24 million to evaporate

A slip of flimsy paper was still worth \$23.7 million up until midnight June 9, but if the holder didn't speak up, the paper became useless after that.

That's when the one-year expiration date is up on the winning Big Game ticket purchased in New Jersey.

State lottery officials said that if the unwitting — or possibly procrastinating — winner does not come forward, the unclaimed prize will be the largest in state history.

### Men raise stink in store

## EDC board to discuss gymnastics center

Among the agenda items for the board of directors of the Muleshoe Economic Development Corp. meeting Tuesday is the possibility of helping a gymnastics center locate in Muleshoe.

Acrosports already operates a good-size program in Levelland, with smaller satellite operations in Sudan and Friona that would be combined in Muleshoe.

The project calls for Acrosports to put down 25 percent in order to qualify for a Small Business Administration loan.

The board meeting is scheduled to begin at 5:30 p.m. in the council chambers at city hall. Also on the agenda is an update on applications for dairy permits in Bailey County and discussion of a brochure prepared for prospective dair-

ies.

Will Green of Levelland, who would manage the new facility, said last week that it is this down payment that may require help from local economic development funds.

The project would be housed in a 6,600-square-foot building — "one of the most modern in the U.S., and with THE most modern equipment," Green said. That would include "a foam pit, where athletes could do large skills into it without fear of injuring themselves."

Dunn is the daughter of

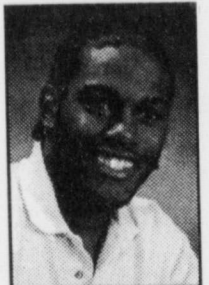
Stacy and Michelle Dunn of Bledsoe. She plans to attend South Plains College to begin her education toward becoming a speech pathologist.

## Record number of moths due to armyworm

COLLEGE STATION — North Texas has been troubled by a large number of moths that have occupied the area in recent weeks, the Texas Agricultural Extension Service reports.

Dr. Mike Merchant, Extension entomologist, said a record number of moths have been feeding on weeds and roadside bushes.

"They're a mixture of different kinds of moths collectively called noctuids," Merchant said. "They're a drab-colored brown or light-colored moths, with about a 1-inch wingspan."

During the day, the moths are found in bushes, grass along roadsides and in fields. At night they are attracted to streetlights and car headlights.

"Most of these moths will produce caterpillars known as armyworms and cutworms," Merchant said. "Some of them might pose problems for landscapes and gardens, but most feed on weeds and other roadside plants."

In the Panhandle, some beet armyworm caterpillar activity continues. Most of the region's cotton is planted, while on the South Plains just under half of the crop is planted.

Merchant warned producers and home gardeners not to panic if they notice moths.

"You don't need to spray if you see moths," Merchant said. "Moths simply warn us that in a few weeks there might be a problem with caterpillars."

Home gardeners who notice moths in their gardens should

look for caterpillar leaf-feeding damage in the next three to four weeks. Infected plants can be treated with a low-impact insecticide like *Bacillus thuringiensis*.

Farmers should scout fields for armyworm damage on a regular basis over the next month, Merchant said.

"Make sure fields get scouted and check them on a regular basis," he said.

For some, distinguishing between a moth and a butterfly may be difficult to do. Merchant said the basic distinction between the two is that a butterfly will fly during the day and a moth will fly at night.

"That's true 99 percent of the time," Merchant said.

There seems to be no single cause for this year's bumper

crop of moths.

Normally, moths are present all summer at fluctuating levels.

"Insects are really hard to predict, and we don't always have a good reason why some years become outbreak years," Merchant said. "Certainly we had a colder and wetter than average winter this year."

Dr. Chris Sansone, Extension entomologist in San Angelo, reported a large number of mesquite cutworms on mesquite and more than the usual number of moths in West Texas. Sansone said the moths in his area appear to be thinning out, and hopes they will disappear in the next 10 days.

Fortunately, relief should be in sight with warmer temperatures.

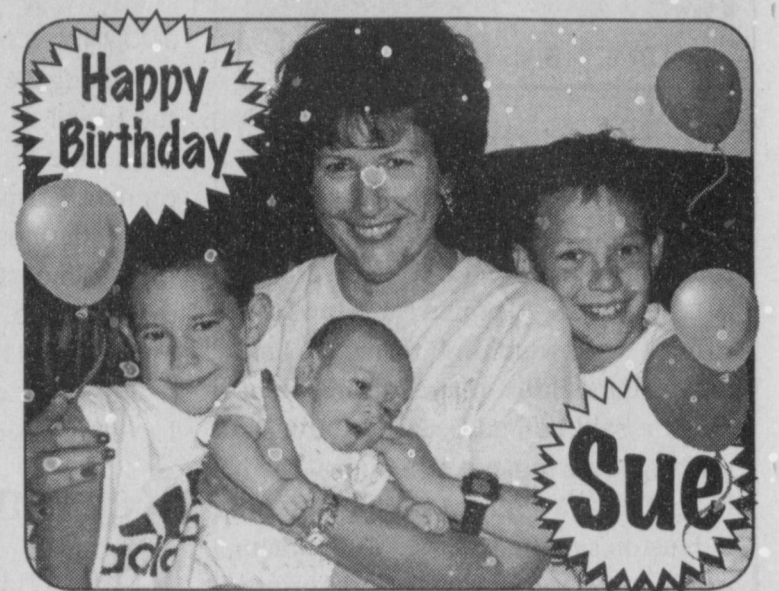

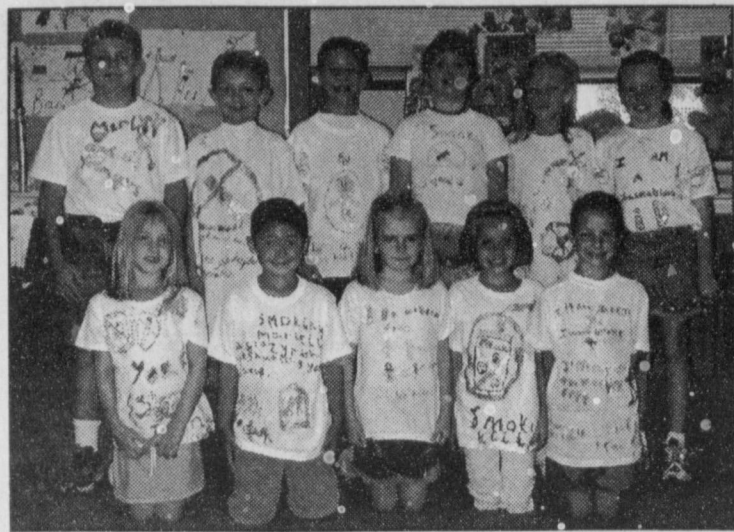

## TODAY'S RECIPE

### CHILI VERDE

8 oz. (1 1/4 cups) dry pinto beans

1 lb. boneless, skinless chicken breasts (2 cups cooked)

1 4-oz. can chopped green chilies

1 tsp. ground cumin

3/4 tsp. dried oregano leaves

1/8 tsp. ground cloves

1/8 tsp. cayenne pepper

3 cups water

3 chicken bouillon cubes

1 tsp. minced garlic (1 clove)

1 tsp. salt

2/3 cup finely chopped onion

1 cup grated low-fat Monterey Jack cheese

1 dozen flour tortillas

1 11 1/2-oz. jar salsa

Rinse pinto beans, soak them in cold water overnight, then drain them.

Cut chicken into 1-inch cubes; cook in small amount of water until no longer pink.

Combine beans, water, bouillon cubes, garlic, salt and onion in a large pot; bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer until beans are soft — about an hour. Add more water if necessary.

Combine chicken and spices with beans; simmer 30 minutes more, stirring occasionally.

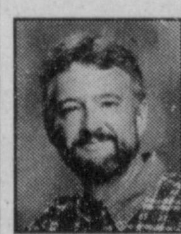
Top chili with salsa and grated cheese (if desired); serve with warmed flour tortillas.

A friend and colleague who preaches in Phoenix described an interesting experience the other day. He was driving down the freeway, as was his custom, and out of his peripheral vision, a changed sign caught his eye. It was the sign for what had been a little Baptist Church. He barely

remembered the name on the sign, didn't know what particular Baptist association the church had been affiliated with, and didn't particularly care, but he knew it had been a Baptist Church of very modest size which he probably would hardly have noticed at all except that he had performed a wedding there once upon a time.

He knew it had been a Baptist church. But, as he later drove down the freeway the other direction and paid close attention this time, he saw strange letters on the sign, and where the cross had been, a crescent moon. That church is now an Islamic Community Center.

Within spitting distance from that particular point in the Phoenix freeway were once a number of Christian churches of varying flavors including two Baptist, one Church of Christ, and one Nazarene. Those churches would almost certainly disagree on some points of faith and practice

(mostly of the molehill variety and just maybe one or two mountains among the various pious peaks the various groups like to label as mountains), but they all are serious about honoring Christ. I happen to know some folks in that particular Church of Christ well enough to know that a few of them are so narrow, as one old preacher said, a gnat could stand on the bridge of their nose and kick out both eyes with one foot. Some of them are, well, a bit hardheaded, but I imagine the Baptist and Nazarene folks across the freeway well balance them with a few counter-part hardheads of their own.

I promise you, though, that each of those churches and their members are there because they want to honor the Lord Jesus and lift up the cross of Christ in that community.

And now there is one less church. And one less sign with a cross. And one less group meeting to honor Christ.

That, my friends, is a loss to more Christians than just Baptists. God help us not to be so willfully blind that we fail to see that!

I don't doubt for a moment that among Muslims, Buddhists, Hindus, etc., are some fine people. I don't share their beliefs, but they are not the "enemy." The Apostle Paul makes it clear that Christ's people fight only against Satan and his dark forces, not against a foe of flesh and blood. If we "conquer" anyone, the "battle" is to be won by love.

But Christians of all stripes should be eternally grateful and actively and vocally thankful for anyone and any group who strive to honor Christ. I'm so thankful for all here who do!

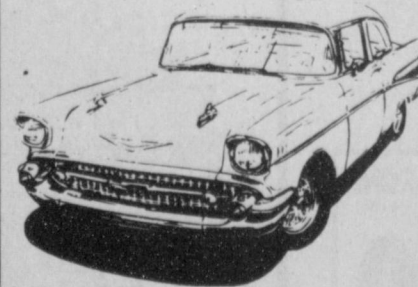
