The Wranglers started their first scoring drive when sophomore Clayton Patton of Killean recovered a NTSU-JV fumble at the Eagles' 42-yard line, giving Cisco its first possession of the ball. Six plays later, sophomore Raymon Hernandez of Wichita Falls booted a 46-yard field goal to give the Wranglers a 3-to-0 lead with 11:53 remaining in the first quarter.

After the kick, NTSU-JV's freshman quarterback Babel was sacked in the end zone by Cisco sophomore Mike Johnson of Pahokee-Florida for a safety. With 11:04 showing the first quarter, CJC took a 5-to-0 lead.

NTSU-JV then kicked the ball to Cisco and the Wranglers started their possession of the ball on their own 48-yard line. With freshman Mark Pilling of Miami, Florida at quarterback, CJC moved the ball downfield to NTSU-JV's 22-yard line in 12 plays. A pass reception by freshman Darryl Grant of Miami, Florida and runs by freshmen Randy Roe of Livingston and James Dixon of Vernon helped in moving the ball.

In the second quarter of play, Cisco sophomore John Buesing of Vernon recovered a NTSU-JV fumble at the Eagles' 28-yard line. CJC scored on their first play with a 28-yard touchdown pass from QB Pilling to sophomore Phillip Walton of Waco-Richfield. With sophomore Neal Kemper placing the ball, Hernandez booted the extra point for a 15-to-0 lead with 8:15 left in the second quarter.

In their final possession before half-time, CJC started out on their own 13-yard line and six plays later scored. Freshman David Dacus of Kingsville filled in at quarterback and Roe and Dixon gained rushing yardage.

Cisco High School's Lobo Junior Varsity started their year off slow this week as they lost to DeLeon by the score of 20-to-0 here Thursday night. JV Coach Jerry Reeves said, since it was the first ball game of the year, he believes the team was just not prepared mentally for the game.

Coach Reeves said, "They have a long way to go, but I think they realize that." He also said he expects to see better performance in the future than Thursday night.

He said Cisco had two injured players who did not play Thursday night and with a squad of 18 (eight sophomores and 10 freshmen), they are going to have to try not to have any key injuries. He said the squad is not very strong this year depth-wise.

Offensive players for Cisco who turned in good performances were Larry Fields, quarterback Jarrod Jeffcoat, and Joe Flores.

Coach Reeves said Joe Flores also was probably the

outstanding player on defense. He said, "Joe played a good ball game."

Other defensive players turning in good performances were Mark McGinness, Jarrod Jeffcoat, Doud Witt, and John Clark.

In Thursday night's game, DeLeon scored in the first quarter on a four-yard run and in the second quarter on a one-yard run. Neither extra point attempt succeeded, leaving the half-time score at 12-to-0.

In the final quarter of play,

DeLeon added an 88-yard touchdown run to the score as well as two extra points, making the final score 20-to-0.

Coach Reeves is the head coach for the JV this year and he is assisted by Coach Terry Minton.

CofC Board Plans Seminar For Retail

Plans for an in-depth seminar on marketing and advertising for Cisco retail business firms will be made at a meeting Monday, Sept. 9, at the Chamber of Commerce it was decided at a meeting of the CofC board of directors last Tuesday.

Manager Don Shepard reported that Fred Cross, Texas A&M University Extension System official, would be here with planning the seminar. The training course will be available to all merchants and will be conducted over two or three months.

In other action, the board appointed a committee composed of Bill Austin, Brad Kimbrough, Gerald Winnett, Ivan Webb and Mr. Ferguson to inspect and repair materials and equipment used in lighting downtown streets during the Christmas holidays. This work will begin in the near future.

A budget committee of Bobby Smith, chairman, Billy Wright and Joe Cooper was appointed by the president.

Vice President Shirley Hargrave reported that the program to repair the downtown hanging baskets was well underway. Flowers in the baskets are to be replaced with silk artificial flowers. Re-doing the baskets is costing some \$30 apiece and numerous Civic service and civic clubs have been underwriting a basket. Working with Mrs. Hargrave are Mrs. Helen Orr and Mrs. Deborah Whitley.

Mrs. Hargrave told the board that the CofC beautification committee would have a report on its planning work in the near future.

Mrs. Linda Cozart, chairman of the retail trade committee, gave a report on the recent style show and the Little Mr./Miss Cisco contest. She said they were outstanding programs.

An official of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce will be here Sept. 23rd to conduct a seminar on "Nuts and Bolts of Marketing" for the benefit of

local merchants, it was announced.

The board approved plans for Manager Shepard to attend the Texas Industrial Commission conference in Corpus Christi on Sept. 19-20.

Public Schools Gain In 1985 Enrollment

Enrollment for the 1985-86 fall semester in the Cisco Public Schools totalled 973 students, which represents a gain of 17 over the peak enrollment for last year, according to a report Friday by Superintendent Ray Saunders.

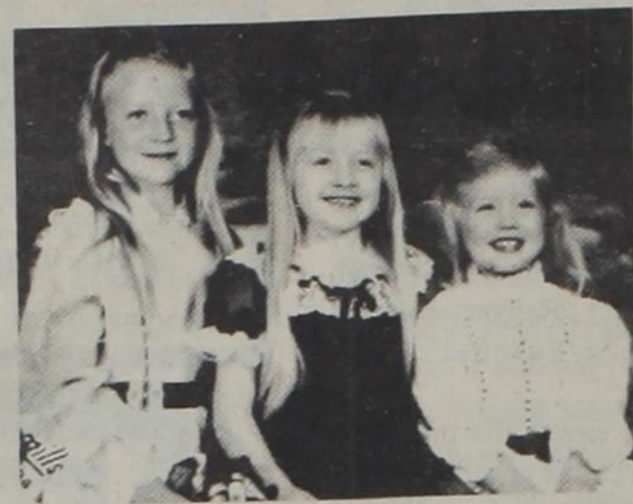

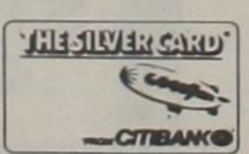

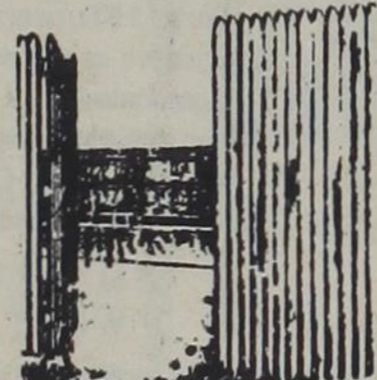

Number Of Changes Will Go Into Effect At Schools

With school underway once more, activities and family schedules have undergone a radical change from the pace of summer. With the new year many changes will go into effect regarding the education of school age children. These changes were brought about by the implementation of House Bill (H.B.) 72 of the Texas Legislature.

Students in grades 1-6 must have a grade average of 70 or above in all subjects. They must also have a grade of 70 or above in math and language arts.

Students in grades 7 and 8 must have a grade average of 70 or above in all subjects.

In addition, they must have a grade of 70 or above in three of the four following subjects: language arts, math, science, and social studies. Reading improvement classes will be required of all students scoring below grade level on their reading achievement test the previous year.

Students in grades 9-12 must have a grade of 70 or above in each course taken in order to receive credit for that subject. Social promotions are no longer possible in grades 1-12 for students not having the required passing grades.

Parents will be notified at the end of the first three weeks of each six weeks of unsatisfactory or failing grades. They will also be notified if grades are borderline between passing and failing. A conference with the teacher of that class should be arranged at this time.

These conferences may be scheduled through the principal's office of each school. The principals and teachers

will be available to discuss remediation during the students who are failing.

Students in grades 1,3,5,7, and 9 will be given an Assessment of Minimum Skills Test in the spring for reading, writing, and mathematics. Students in grade 12 will be given a test in the spring measuring competencies in mathematics and English language arts.

Students graduating in May of 1987, this year's juniors, will be required to master the math and English language arts sections of the Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills (TEAMS). This test will be given in October and April of this and each succeeding year.

Students will be required to receive a diploma. Students not mastering the October test may repeat the test in May of each year. The test may be repeated as many times as necessary until the score indicates mastery.

Students will be given achievement test batteries during the spring, testing the norms and grade level of all students.
