Number Of Changes Will Go Into Effect At Schools

With school underway once more, activities and family schedules have undergone a radical change from the pace of summer. With the new year many changes will go into effect regarding the education of school age children. These changes were brought about by the implementation of House Bill (H.B.) 72 of the Texas Legislature.

Students in grades 1-6 must have a grade average of 70 or above in all subjects. They must also have a grade of 70 or above in math and

Students in grades 7 and 8 must have a grade average of 70 or above in all subjects. In addition, they must have a grade of 70 or above in three of the four following subjects: language arts, math, science, and social studies. Reading improvement classes will be required of all students scoring below grade level on their reading achievement test the previous year.

Students in grades 9-12 must have a grade of 70 or above in each course taken in order to receive credit for that subject. Social promotions are no longer possible in grades 1-12 for students not having the required passing grades.

Parents will be notified at the end of the first three weeks of each six weeks of unsatisfactory or failing grades. They will also be notified if grades are borderline between passing and failing. A conference with the teacher of that class should be arranged at this

These conferences may be scheduled through the principal's office of each school. The principals and teachers

will be available to discuss remediation during these conferences for the students who are failing.

Students in grades 1,3,5,7, and 9 will be given an Assessment of Minimum Skills Test in the spring for reading, writing, and mathematics. Students in grade 12 will be given a test in the spring measuring competencies mathematics and English language arts.



Students will be given achievement test batteries during the spring, testing the norms and grade level of all students.


