## FARMERS AND BANKS

The house committee, while eliminating the senat provision for an additional member on the federal reserve board, requires the president to give due consideration to he farm interests in appointing members. It may, therefore, be expected, if this measure passes, that the president wiil appoint a farmer to the next vacancy, which will very
likely occur in August with the retirement of Governor Harding.

Just what this change wili accomplish remains to be een. Some critics of the measure have insisted that it
ould make no practical difference at all in the handling of loans and credits, because of the limitations of the oard's functions.

The spokesman for the farming interests seems to expect a good deal in the way of loosening up bank credit and giving additional advantages to the agricultural population through the moral influence on bankers in general, if not by specific changes in the reserve board's policy. Several million farmers will await the result with interest and no less interest may be expected from other conomic groups.

If the farmers can obtain definite representation on benefit from governs national finance, an will come from the manufacturing or commercial class, from union labor, religious or other interests. However, this does not necessarily follow.
