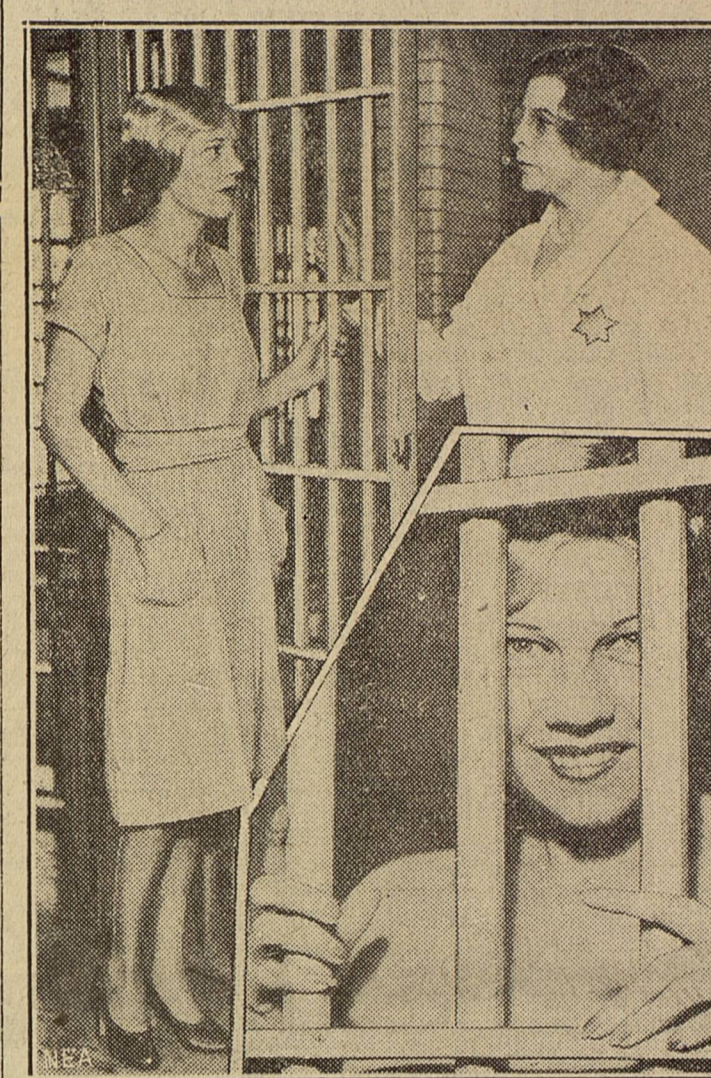

THREE MEN AND WOMAN ARE TAKEN

Quartet Investigated for Chico and Boyd Holdups

DECATUR, Jan. 30.—Three men and a woman arrested in a camp near the Bridgeport dam, were in jail here today as suspects in two recent bank robberies.
