

# IN 1985 **Memorial at Peal Harbor**

By H.V. & GayNell O'Brien One of the high points of our trip came on the last day. We de-shipped about 9 a.m. Saturday and after claiming baggage, taking it to the Honolulu airport and checking it we were free to do Pearl Harbor and the USS Arizona Memorial. We were later getting to it than we'd planned and the lines were long, but the U.S. Parks Service and the U.S. Navy which operate the facility jointly, have it so well organized that there's no problems. Upon arrival you/ take a number for a tour and wait in shops and museums until your number is called. The tour begins with a brief talk by a Park Ranger who sets the mood, reminding that this is a burial place and not a tourist attraction for fun and games. In answer to her audiencewide question "Where were you on Dec. 7, 1941?" (Many of course answered that they were not even born). One man answered: "Fighting for my life on a ship right here in Pearl Harbor." After an enlightning film of news reels and informative graphics, which vividly gave the details of the attack of that day, the audience moves out of the comfortable theater onto a pier and

chored in that fateful Sunday of long ago, in the area known then as Battleship Row.

In addition to the Arizona Memorial there are still marked morings in the harbor showing where other ships were berthed. (Today we are reading of the Navy's dispersal of its fleets including major new harbors at Corpus Christi).

The memorial is an enclosed bridge, spanning (but not touching) the sunken hull of the Arizona, where 1,102 American servicemen found their final resting place. It was dedicated in 1962.

From the launch, you enter the memorial, which is divided into three sections: a museum, the assembly area which can hold 200 people and the shrine room. "The form (of the memorial), at the ends, expresses initial defeat and ultimate victory." Wide openings in the walls and roof permit a flooding of sunlight and a close view of the sunken battleship eight feet below, both fore and after. At low tide, as the sun shines on the hull, the barnacles, which encrust it shimmer like jewels. Oil still seeps up.

# Sheriff Don Underwood Refuses To Sign Bank Note

Sheriff Don Underwood, during a called meeting of the Eastland County Commissioners Court July 25, refused to sign any bank note which might be arranged to cover deficits and funding for his department until Oct. 1.

Commissioners present at the meeting were Richard Robinson, Pct. 1, L.T. Owen, Pct 3, and C.B. Dill, Pct. 4. Jack Blackwell, Pct. 2, was absent due to illness. County Judge Scott Bailey presided over both the morning and afternoon meetings.

The Sheriff's refusal came as the Commissioners worked on the 1985-86 operating budget of the county, which is expected to total around 2 1/2 million dollars. A report from the Eastland County Tax Appraisal Office indicated that the county would probably receive something over 2 million dollars from its tax rolls for the next fiscal year.

Several divisions of the Sheriff's Department are

totaling around \$14,000 in the red. This does not include the July 22 authorization for payment of old bills, or an extra \$15,000 allottment for jail food, which was granted in the spring. Sheriff Underwood stated that about \$3,000 of this food money still re-

mains. He mentioned that it would take about \$18,066 per month to finish the year in the Sheriff's Department, and he would need around \$23,000 extra in order to do this.

Early during the morning meeting Judge Scott Bailey told the Commissioners that he was attempting to negotiate a loan with a Depository Bank, as the court had requested him to do. There was not enough residue in the general funds to absorb the current overdraft, the Judge said. The General Depository Bank had indicated a willingness to loan the county money at 8 percent interest. A bank holding the District Clerk's Trust Funds, however, had

said they did not think it would be possible to pledge this type of funds. "Do I hear a motion from

"Me borrow the money?" Underwood Sheriff answered.

"Well, it's your budget," the Judge replied. "If one of the Commissioners overspent what was allotted him, he would need to borrow the money and pay it back."

Sheriff Underwood appeared to question the legality of such an arrangement. "I don't think there's any provision in the law for this kind of loan," he said.

He went on to tell of how he had become involved in a borrowing situation when he was the Sheriff of Nolan County. He had signed a note approved by the Nolan 'oun-

ty Commissioners, he said, for money to "work narcotics"

"Later the County Attorney advised the Commissioners that they could not do that, and I had to pay the money back. I'm not getting into that kind of a financial judgement again," the Sheriff said. Henry Zepeda, a jail

guard, then questioned the Commissioners.

The Cisco Press

"Isn't it premature to be borrowing money and paying interest," he asked, "until such time as the General Fund has no money?"

He suggested that there ought to be enought general cash flow to absorb current overdrafts until the next fisxal year.

Emma Morris, County Auditor, replied that the County money was all budgeted, and extra expenses on Courthouse repair were coming up also.

# Wage And Hour Law **Changes Considered**

The afternoon meeting of the Eastland County Commissioners included more discussion of the 1985-86 County budget, and an effort to work out ways to comply with the current Wage and Hour laws.

Since much of the proposed overtime pay - though certainally not all - is involved with the Sheriff's Department, an attempt was made to resolve difficulties in this arca.

Some reference was made to a letter from Sheriff Underwood to the Commissioners concerning back pay to the Department's employees.

One Commissioner remarked that if this plan was followed it would cost the County about \$75,000 extra dollars.

The Commissioners indicated that the County was working out compliance. Overtime pay was not retroactive under current guidelines or the manner in which time had been turned in from the Department.

Personnel from the County Auditor's office had been working with a Mr. Carmichael of the Wage and Hour Division of the Labor Department in Abilene. By using his suggestions a 28 made a motion to adopt the 28 day pay period and a set salary plan.

A question was brought before the Court by Reserve Officer Jody Heflin, as to whether employees in the Sheriff's Department would have to work a large number of hours to make the same

wages. "We'd have rather left it like it was," a Commissioner replied. "But the Commissioners have the last say, because they are the governing body. They have the right to adjust wages to stay within the budget, so long as they pay minimum wage." It was pointed out that

under the 28 day pay plan the Sheriff's Department personnel would receive approx. the same wages as before.

Sheriff Don Underwood then came into the meeting, stating that he had consulted by phone with Dwight Martin of the State Attorney General's office as to guidelines on this matter. Federal Guidelines were now in the mail to Judge Scott Bailey, Martin had reported.


#### EASTLAND




## **Dean's List**




