



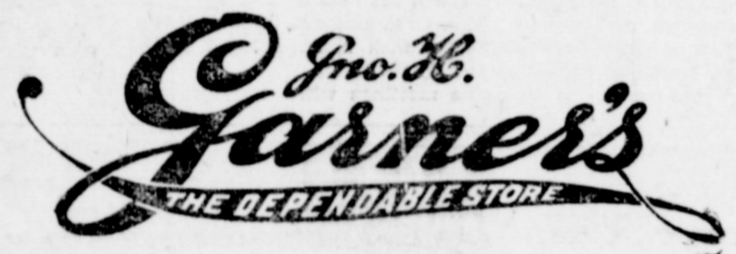

**LARGE SAVINGS TO FARMERS EFFECTED BY CO-OPERATIVES**

WASHINGTON, Aug. 26.—Co-operative farmers' associations in the northern and western states, whose organization was promoted by county agents last year effected a saving to the members of \$5,434,500, according to reports made to the states relations service, United States department of agriculture. The governing principle in all activities on the part of county agents sharing in co-operative movements has been not to act as the direct business agent of the farmer or an organized group, but to assist farmers in determining what form of local organization is desirable and to secure expert assistance, when available, in organization methods. The county agent also helps guard the community against over-organization and wherever practicable advocates the use of existing agencies. The co-operative associations which the county agents have helped form have had to do both with production and distribution and include co-operative grain elevators, creameries and livestock selling associations.
