COX A PRINTER'S DEVIL, A TEACHER---NEWSPAPERMAN ---CONGRESSMAN---GOVERNOR

James Middleton Cox was three times Governor of Ohio---an honor enjoyed by only one other Ohioan, Rutherford B. Hayes.

Legislation for which Governor Cox is best known includes a model workmen's compensation law and a child-labor law which have been extensively copied by other states.
