## JUVENILE IMMIGRANTS

One phase of Canadian immigration that is quite difimmigration. In the fiscai year 1923-24, according to the supervisors' report, 2,080 child immigrants came to Can-
ada. In that same period more than 22,000 applications were received, indicating that very careful selection was made. The homes to which such children are sent are also carefully selected and inspection is continued long enoug
to be sure that the child is happy and properly cared for A typical inspection report tells of a 9 -year-orid girl who had come to Canada and been adopted in a childless home at the age of six. The child is now receiving every educa-
tional advantage, is well clothed and happy, with foster parents of intelligence as well as affection.

Canada likes its child immigrants for several reasons. They come to Canada young and grow up regard
ing Canada as their natural home. They are selected of good British stock, so that their early home training has been similar to what they will receive in their adopted
homes. The movement happily combines the finding of homes for orphans and needy children with finding chil dren for childless homes. It is said that many of Canada's
first child immigrants have become prominent and suefirst child immigr
cessful farmers.

EVOLVING A HOME-OWNER
