

State Comptroller Reports On City Sales Tax

State Comptroller Bob Bullock said rebates to Texas cities of the optional one-percent city sales tax climbed to more than a half billion dollars this year. Bullock said payments of \$80.1 million for November

brings the yearly total to \$526.9 million...nearly \$60 million more than cities received during 1979. Eastland's check this month will be \$22,423.37, bringing the city's year-to-date total to more than \$139

million in sales tax rebates. Ranger will receive a check for \$14.5 million this month, boosting the cities payments for the last 11 months to \$94.6 million. Cisco's \$34.5 million payment for November will push that city's 1980 payments to \$156.5 million

for the year. Gorman will receive \$5.5 million bringing total payments for the year to \$24.9 million. Rising Star's \$4.4 million payment for the month of November also will push that city's 1980 payment to \$18.8 million for the year. The city's sales tax is collected along with the state sales tax by merchants and businesses and rebated monthly by the Comptroller's office to the cities where it is levied.

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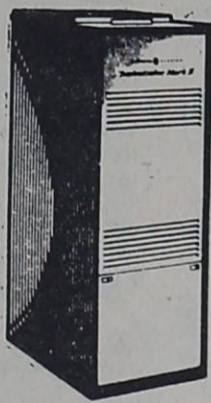

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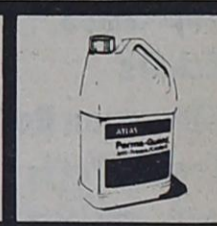

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

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Hints For The Aged & Handicapped

Dear Par—Please send our organization some information on a new agency that has been set up to handle a nationwide program for the elimination of architectural barriers. Please include committee members names and we would like to know the percentage of handicapped members on this board.—Mr. M.D.M., Jr., Kansas.

Dear Mr. M.—I am sure you must be referring to the establishment of the National Center for Barrier Free Environment (NCBFE). It is a national non-profit organization concerned exclusively with the creation of physical facilities which are accessible to persons with disabilities.

The center has announced plans for a major expansion of its accessibility-related services. The new effort, made possible by a contract recently awarded to NCBFE through an inter-agency funding agreement between HEW's Office of Civil Rights and the Community Services Administration, will open several new positions, for which applications are invited immediately.

Under the contract, the National Center will develop an Access Center which will become the Nation's most comprehensive source of information, education, technical assistance and research on accessibility matters. The Access Center's programs will be an extension of the services which NCBFE has been providing since 1974.

Jack Armstrong, NCBFE Executive Director, stated the Access Center will include a computerized information system-data bank, a telephone "Hot Line", technical assistance services and an extensive publication program. "The implementation of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 is causing a tremendous demand from Federal fund recipients for information about accessibility and barrier free design," he said. "The Access Center will be designed to provide such information, as well as assistance with problems related to the creation of an accessible environment. We anticipate participation by other Federal agencies during the coming year, and the Access Center should eventually become a centralized resource which any Federal agency can use to respond to inquiries from its fund recipients. The Access Center's services will also be available to the general public."

Knowledge of accessibility issues and barrier free design principles will be given strong consideration in the selection of candidates to fill the available positions. People with disabilities are specifically urged to apply. All applicants must be willing to relocate to the Washington, D.C. area, but funds will not be available for moving expenses.

Salaries for each position will be competitive with salaries for similar positions

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Field Dressing Critical To Successful Deer Hunt

UVALDE - Stalking and shooting a prize buck (or doe) is a big part of the challenge deer hunting offers sportsmen. But there's a lot more to it than just "aim and shoot."

For the beginning or inexperienced hunter, the sequence of events occurring immediately after the kill can well mean the difference between taking home a handsome wall mount or returning with a severely butchered-up carcass and perhaps little else to show for the effort.

Yet, performing this critical function correctly isn't as complicated as one might tend to assume, says Dr. Dwight Guynn, Texas Agricultural Extension Service wildlife specialist headquartered in Uvalde.

After the deer has been

killed, promptly tag and prepare it for field dressing by propping the animal on its back, using rocks or other available objects.

The initial step, according to Guynn, is to remove external sex organs with a sharp knife. Next, cut down to the pelvic bone. Turning the knife blade up, use your other hand to hold the belly away from the intestinal organs and cut up to the breastbone.

However, avoid cutting the skin any further forward than the middle of the breastbone if the head is to be mounted, Guynn stresses.

Continuing the process, hold intestines to one side while cutting the thin layer of muscle, or diaphragm, which separates the intestines from the chest area. Reach into the rib cage and

cut loose the windpipe and esophagus as far forward as possible. Grasp the windpipe and esophagus with both hands, pulling those organs out. The intestines can now be pulled free of the pelvic region.

Next, Guynn says to cut the skin and muscles around the anus, being careful not to puncture the bladder. Then pull the intestine forward and free of the carcass.

In these few short minutes, the hunting cycle is complete. The animal has been shot and field dressed and is ready to be hung to cool.

JSince the skin can be removed easier while the carcass is still warm, you may want to consider skinning the animal soon after field dressing. If the head is to be

mounted, Guynn suggests hanging the animal by its hind legs and skinning from the hind legs downward. You may want to consult a local taxidermist on the best method for skinning the head and neck of your trophy.

Guynn advises leaving the skin free of cuds forward of the front legs so the taxidermist will have enough hide to make a good mount. He says it's also a good idea to salt or freeze the head and skin until it is delivered for mounting.

But if the head is not to be mounted, hang the carcass by its head and skin it from the neck downward. The

Texas A&M University System specialist says the hide is easier to remove in this position. Next, cut the skin loose from around the neck, around the legs and down the inside of each leg. Grasp the skin in back of the head and pull down firmly with both hands.

Finally, hang the skinned carcass by its hind legs in shade to cool and age. If hung outside, use a protective covering to keep insects off the carcass.

The carcass can now be cut to preference or it can be commercially processed. Handling techniques after

the kill will greatly influence final meat quality. Guynn strongly encourages field dressing the animal soon

after being shot and hanging the carcass so it will cool thoroughly. He says skinning the animal soon after field dressing seems to enhance meat quality slightly. But if the animal must be transported or aged before processing, it's best to leave the skin intact to prevent the outer surface from drying out.

Texas white-tailed deer season opens at daylight Nov. 15 and closes, in most counties, at sundown on Jan. 4. Good hunting!

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Farm/City Week Focus On 'Partners In Progress

This year's Farm-City Week focuses on farm and city people together as partners in progress as the key to the future.

Farm-City Week, Nov. 21-27, is sponsored by the Farm-City Council and Kiwanis International.

"Farm and city people depend on each other for products and services that are essential to modern business and living," points out Dr. Carl Anderson, economist in marketing with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. "One group can't live without the other. Together they make the best

food and fiber team in the world."

A basic ingredient for the economic, political and social success of a country is a highly productive agricultural base, believes Anderson. This gives a country the capacity to not only feed its own people but also to export for economic gain as well as for humanitarian purposes.

"One U.S. farm worker now produces enough food for some 45 people at home and another 25 overseas," says the economist. "At the turn of the century, one American farm worker could feed only seven peo-

ple."

A dozen eggs, a sack of potatoes, a slab of bacon, a steak, a chilled fresh fryer, a carton of milk and hundreds of other items can be bought at almost any food store at a comparatively reasonable cost - reasonable, that is, compared with the cost of most other things.

"While the overall cost of living has advanced 13 percent from a year ago, food prices in the grocery store have increased less than 10 percent," Anderson explains. "Americans, on average, spend 17 percent of their income on food compared to 45 percent for people in Russia."

One out of every 25 Texans is a farmer or rancher, yet 30 percent of the state's retail trade business is directly associated with agricultural

production and selling of food and fiber products. Thousands of businesses are active in food and fiber production, transportation, processing, packaging, storing, advertising, distribution and other activities associated with feeding, clothing and, to some extent, housing people, notes the economist.

"In Texas, movement of food and fiber from field to factory to the family table furnishes jobs and income for about a fourth of the working force," points out Anderson.

The future for continued growth in Texas agriculture is bright, he believes. Demand for food and fiber from countries overseas is growing. And, with good export facilities, the state's agricultural industry is ready to expand its share of the export market. This means more jobs and in-

come for both rural and urban residents.

"No doubt, agriculture makes a large contribution to the Texas' affluence. Because quality food is available at reasonable prices, a large part of our income is available to buy other things," notes Anderson.

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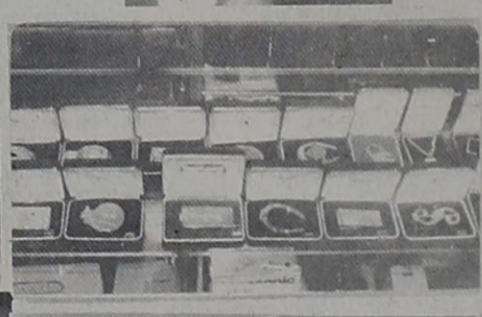
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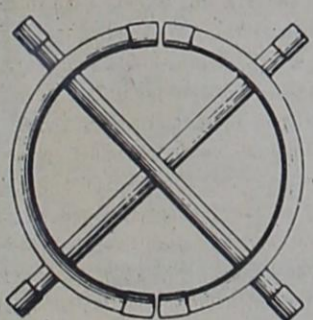
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People Things
