

Careful consumption of water, vith none for lawns and gardens will be required if Cross Plains supply is to prove adequate throughout the Summer, city officials announced yesterday.

Increased consumption caused by extended dry weather has kept the city reservoir dangerously low for more than a week, and it is pointed out that unless the irrigating of lawns and gardens is suspended im Already the supply is so strained that a fire would likely dry every hydrant in town for six or eight

The city plans no snooping to ee whether or not lawns and gardens are being irrigated, only a candid, frank statement of the wazens to cooperate, however, if this fails to produce the desired result "watching program" will necesarily be instituted to safeguard public health and assure equitable

In an effort to increase the water supply, two more wells, which have been out of use for years, were expected to be ready for pumping
