The map will show each unit o area in the United States properly numbered. Each postoffice will be furnished with a map suitable for use in the unit in which that postoffice is located. The guide will contain the regulations for the co
duct of the service and a list duct of the service and a list of unit numbers.

in the oarcels post mails under regulations as to size and weight plicabl-to other parcels post packpiges, but at the rate of postage of 1 cent for each two ounces ar fractions thereof, regardiess of distance All maatter now classified as thirdclass matter will not be permitted in the parcels post mails.
