

Freddie Chittum of Baird, received a five year probated sentence after confessing obtaining controlled drugs by forging doctor's signatures and using the names of some of the Golden Holiday Nursing Home patients while he was director of nurses at the Golden Holiday Nursing Home in Baird.

Chittum said that he had a problem with this particular drug but did not consider himself addicted to it. Reports show that none of the patients at the home received any unprescribed drugs.

Chittum is presently undergoing drug

treatment in Bailene and was ordered to continue to do so by the court. He has been employed as a rough-neck since his dismissal at the Golden Holiday Nursing

The judge said he would allow Chittum to transfer his probation to Bexar county where he has a job waiting for him at a San Antonio Hospital.

Criminal District Attorney, Lynn Ingalsbe and Chittum's lawyer, Dick Harris, of Abilene, both reccomended the 5 year probated term to the court. Chittum could have received up to 20 years in prison and a fine of up to \$10,000.


to whether or not to purchase uniforms.


