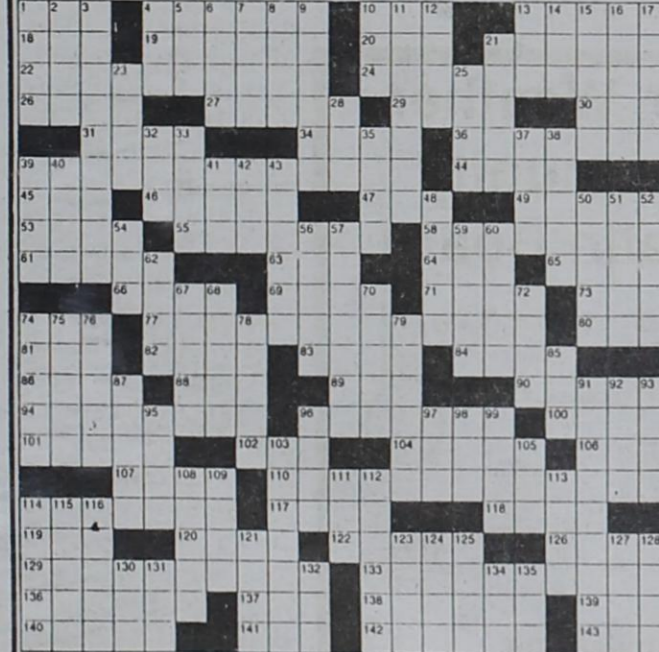

## 'Sense and Sensibility' also has a strong love story, and interesting characters.

The story is set in a rural town in England, where two dowryless sisters Elinor (Emma Thompson) and Marianne (Kate Winslet) have suitors including Hugh Grant who must decide whether to marry for love or for money.

The film evokes Austen's vision of the dance of the sexes; the Dashwood sisters, caught up in lovestruck dreams and fears of destitution, and the men, compulsively fickle except for the temperate devotion of Colonel Brandon (Alan Rickman).

Distributed by Columbia Pictures, the movie is rated PG. Admission is the usual \$3.50 at the box office, with balcony seats available to adults at \$5. Curtain time will be 7:30 nightly, Friday, March 22 through Monday, March 25.

## Amoco, Exxon Lead State Oil And Gas Producers In '95

Railroad Commission statistics show Amoco Production Company and Exxon Corporation to be the top oil and gas producers, respectively, in Texas for 1995, Commission Chairman Carole Keeton Rylander, and Commissioners Barry Williamson and Charles R. Matthews announced.

Amoco led all oil producers for the period with an average daily production of 117,142 barrels, some 8.352 percent of all oil produced in the state. Exxon took second place with an average daily production rate of 87,050 barrels, some 6.206 percent of total state production. Other companies in the top ten included Shell Western E&P Inc., 63,767 bpd (barrels per day), third; Marathon Oil Company, 60,583 bpd, fourth; Mobil Producing

Tx. & N.M. Inc., 56,466 bpd, fifth; Chevron U.S.A. Inc., 49,442 bpd, sixth; Texaco E&P Inc., 47,355 bpd, seventh; Amerada Hess Corporation, 44,182 bpd, eighth; Parker & Parsley Development L.P., 39,632 bpd, ninth; and Union Oil Company of California, 25,884 bpd, tenth.

The Commissioners said Exxon Corporation was the top Texas gas producer for the period, averaging 728,311 Mcf (thousand cubic feet) per day which represented 5.874 percent of total state production. Union Pacific Resources Company was second, averaging 668,128 Mcf per day, or 5.388 percent of all gas produced in the state. Other companies included Shell Western E&P, 541,002 Mcf, third; Mobil Producing Tx. & N.M. Inc., 515,849 Mcf, fourth; Trans-Texas Gas Corporation, 498,741 Mcf, fifth; Chevron U.S.A. Inc., 425,536 Mcf, sixth; Texaco E&P Inc., 407,087 Mcf, seventh; Enron Oil & Gas Company, 318,100 Mcf, eighth; Phillips Petroleum Company, 310,577 Mcf, ninth; and Conoco Inc., 286,031 Mcf, tenth.

Les Beasley might say the only thing special about The Florida Boys is their longevity, but thousands of fans can't be wrong.

For years, they've been flocking to see the group, the only male quartet that's been consistently prominent from the 1950s to today. With No. 1 hits like "Standing on the Solid Rock," "When He Was On the Cross, I Was On His Mind," "Lead Me To the Altar," and "I Lean On You, Lord," the Florida Boys have put out some 100 albums and attained a following of devoted listeners.

So what's at the heart of their success? Beasley, who sings lead and serves as manager of the group, says it's a commitment to

their calling, as well as the fact no individual — including himself — ever became the "star."

"One of the worst things you can do is have a star," he said. "It'll ruin you." Aside from Beasley, the Florida Boys consist of Glen Allred (baritone and guitar), Derrell Stewart (piano), Buddy Liles (bass), Greg Cook (tenor), and Tim Loveless (various instruments). The group officially started in 1947 under the name Gospel Melody Quartet, with J.G. Whitfield at the head.

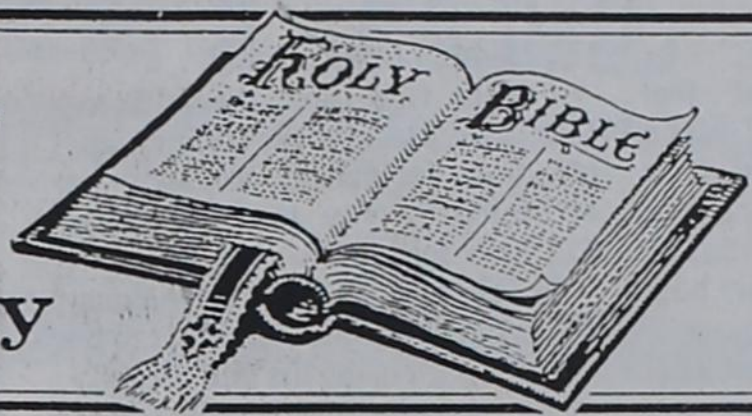

Pray for him down on your knees

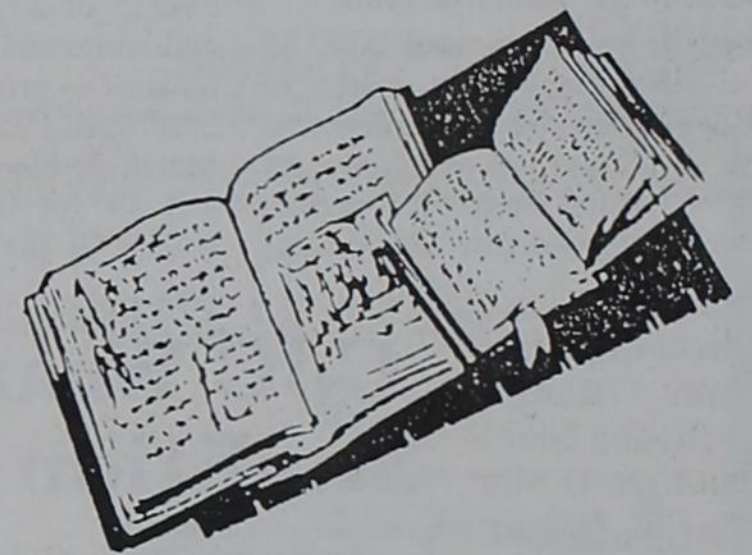

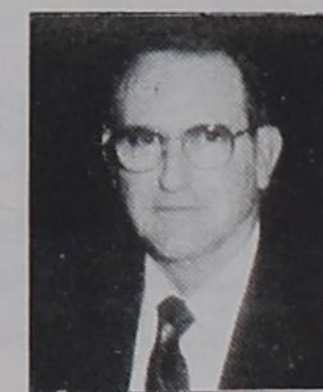

AUSTIN — Gov. George W. Bush is held in high esteem by Texans, according to new ratings in a Texas Poll telephone survey conducted Feb. 21 to March 1.

Bush's job-approval rating of 70 percent is the highest received by a Texas governor in the last 10 years. The survey was conducted for Harte-Hanks Communications by the Office of Survey Research at the University of Texas.

"Gov. Bush is flattered that the people of Texas think he is doing a good job," said the governor's press secretary, Karen Hughes.

Hughes said Texans seem to appreciate Bush's ability to work with the Legislature and his willingness to share credit with Democratic leaders, Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock, who presides over the state Senate and House Speaker Pete Laney.

Bush's approval rating eclipses that of his recent predecessors: Ann Richards peaked at 60 percent in spring 1994; Bill Clements managed a 36 percent mark after taking office in 1987; and Mark White's highwater mark was 42 percent in the winter of 1986.

Poll respondents over age 60 gave Bush the highest marks of any age group. The breakdown by party affiliation was as follows: 88 percent favored Bush's job performance; independents, 66 percent;

and Democrats, 63 percent.

The poll also showed that Republican U.S. Sens. Phil Gramm and Kay Bailey Hutchison both have improved their job approval ratings from 53 percent each last summer to 57 percent for both officials today.

Topping the list as the most important problem in the state was crime, indicated 21 percent of the respondents.

**Moses to Stop Granting Waivers**

No more skipping final exams because of good grades.

Texas Education Commissioner Mike Moses said that next year he would no longer approve funding for students who have been exempted from taking finals because they have good grades.

More than 582 Texas public school districts have waivers from the commissioner that let them collect funding for those students on days they are absent during finals. Schools receive about \$25 a day per student.

"The state has been paying for days when students were not present. I don't feel comfortable with that. I don't believe I have the authority to do that, and besides, I have a philosophical problem with students' not taking final exams," Moses told the *Dallas Morning News*.

When students go to a university, they may find themselves unprepared to take required final exams, Moses said.

**Gun Permit Report Issued**

The Department of Public Safety reports 26,588 concealed handgun permits had been issued from Jan. 1 to March 6.

As of March 3, a DPS report said, white males had been issued 19,313 of 23,615 permits issued, and white and Hispanic males and females — grouped together — had been issued 22,662 permits. As of March 3, blacks held 438 permits and 397 of those were issued to males. Of the grand total, women

held 3,444 of the permits.

For the first time, the DPS released information on rejected applications for permits to carry. As of March 6, only 16 applications had been rejected.

In February, a Grand Prairie man became the first permit holder to be charged with using his gun illegally in the shooting death of a Dallas man.

By March 6, the DPS reported, 59,291 completed applications had been received.

**Other Capital Highlights**

■ For the first time in history, Texas' Republican Primary on March 12 outdrew the Democratic Primary. Political observers say the presidential nomination battle, plus the unusually large number of contested local races on the Republican Primary ballot, attracted conservative Democrats to the GOP Primary.

■ State Comptroller John Sharp has negotiated an arrangement to allow welfare recipients who use the state's Lone Star Card to do their grocery shopping in other states' border towns. Sharp said agreements had been signed with New Mexico, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Louisiana to permit grocery stores to opt into the Lone Star card program.

■ Gov. Bush has designated James Francis Jr. of Dallas to replace Robert Holt as chairman of the Public Safety Commission. Holt will remain on the commission, which Francis joined on March 29, 1995. Francis, a partner in an oil and gas company, served as a special assistant to former Gov. Bill Clements.

■ Donald R. Haragan has been appointed interim president of Texas Tech University and Texas Tech Health Sciences Center. Haragan, who currently serves as executive vice president and provost of Texas Tech, will serve until a permanent successor to Robert W. Lawless is appointed. Lawless has accepted the presidency of the University of Tulsa.

**Oil And Gas Production**

The latest statewide oil and gas production figures show that the downward trend continues in Texas. But there are some bright spots in the picture - Eastland County was one of the areas in which production was up instead of declining.

Callahan County, however, showed a slight decline in both oil and gas for the same reporting period.

The Railroad Commission of Texas reported the following production figures for December, 1995 (The latest totals)

Callahan County: Gas Production - 159,558 Mcf (1,000 Cubic ft.)

Crude Oil - 35,276 barrels

Eastland County: Gas Production - 587,080 Mcf

Crude Oil - 40,355 barrels

In its report the Railroad Commission does not break down the current oil and gas well completions as to county. But state-wide, in Feb. 1996, total well completions for the year to date are reported as 1,429. This is an eight percent increase from the 1,317 recorded

during the same period in 1995.

So it appears that drilling activity has picked up, even though oil prices have remained about the same.

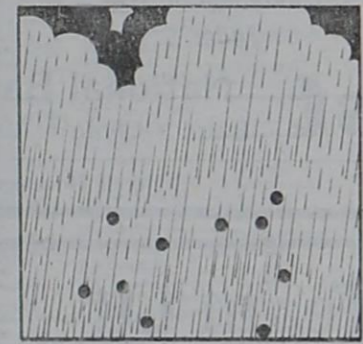

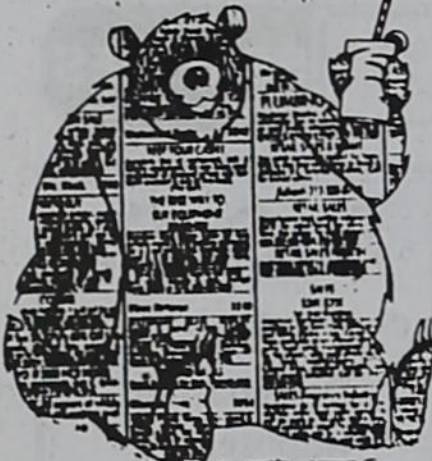

## Remember The Boys In Gray

Samuel Tipton Edwards was born in Alabama in 1844. He came to Texas in 1854 and to Callahan County in 1883. Samuel married Martha Bell on October 13, 1870 in the county of Hood in the state of Texas. She was born in Georgia August 26, 1853, Martha died June 14, 1938 and was buried in the Clyde Cemetery.

The records show S.T. Edwards was a private in Company K, 5th Texas Cavalry, Tom Green's Brigade, Confederate State Army, enlisted July 28, 1862.

Union Prisoner of War records show that he was captured June 28, 1863 at Donaldsonville and received at City Point, Va. July 6, 1863 as a Confederate prisoner of war, paroled for exchange.

Date of discharge April 1865 at Montgomery, Texas.

The 5th Texas Cavalry Regiment was formed at San Antonio, Texas during the late summer of 1861 with about 1,000 officers and men. Most of it's members were from Waco, San Antonio, Bonham, Weatherford, and Austin.

After serving with the Army of New Mexico it was assigned to Green's,

Hardeman's, and Debray's Brigade in the Trans-Mississippi Department.

The 5th fought in Louisiana and reported 99 casualties at Cox's Plantation and 7 at Bayou Bourbeau. Later it moved to Huntsville, Texas and disbanded before the surrender in June, 1865.

S.T. Edwards departed this life on March 24, 1917 in Clyde, Texas and was buried in the Clyde Cemetery, Callahan County, Texas.

To you sons of confederate veterans, we will submit the vindication of the cause for which we fought. To your strength will be given the defense of the confederate soldier's good name, the guardianship of history, the emulation of his virtues, and the perpetuation of those principles he loved. Remember, it is your duty to see that the true history of the south is presented to future generations.

New Books----PATTON: A GENIUS FOR WAR. No other American General of World War II holds the legendary, near mythical status of George S. Patton Jr. The warrior was a biographer's dream and nightmare. Carlo D'Este's PATTON (Harper Collins, \$35) meets the challenge in every way. Patton was dyslexic and considered himself a dullard. His frustration led to extreme mood swings, compulsive behavior and hyperactivity. Patton was spiritually lost in the interwar period of the 1920's and 1930's and without the stability and loyalty of his wife, Beatrice, he might have gone beyond the bounds of sanity. Adolf Hitler gave Patton another chance for the greatness he had enjoyed in World War I. After the end of World War II, Patton felt that the post war Army had no place for him. He intended to return to the United States and resign but

an automobile accident death ended all future plans. He would have been proud of an accolade given not by one of his soldiers, but by a Marine. Hearing of Patton's death and with tears in his eye, this battle-hardened Veteran raised his glass "There died the best (expletive) Marine the Army ever bred!"

In 1945, New York's State health department conducted one of the first and most rigorously controlled research projects in medical history. In both towns, they found the same high incidence of tooth decay. Then on May 2, 1945 a small feeder machine was turned on in Newburgh's filtration plant; from that moment on, Newburgh's water contained 1.2 parts of fluoride per million.

Over the next ten years, doctors and dentists repeatedly checked the children medically and dentally. When the

decade ended, they had found only one difference. In Newburgh, children between six and ten -- who had been drinking fluoridated water all their lives -- had 60% fewer decayed, missing or filled teeth than youngsters from the same age group in Kingston.

Today, fluoridation is accepted and endorsed as a major public health measure in preventing tooth decay by virtually every scientific and health organization in the country.


