the second type are "non-trust fund" taxes. The IRS is very serious about collecting all employment taxes, but taxes withheld from employees - trust fund taxes are in a class by themselves. In fact, there are few areas where the IRS collects more aggressive where it has more weapons at its disposal.

concept of the "responsible person." If trust fund taxes are delinquent, the IRS simply wants someone to pay them, and it doesn't care who. You might be a
company owner, officer, or director, or you might be n employee such as the controller payroll manager, or bookkeeper. If you meet the definition of a "re-
sponsible person," the IRS is likely to hold you persponsible person, the IRS is likely to hold you per-
sonally liable. The IRS typically tries to identify as allowed to proceed against any or all responsible persons simulataneously. Depending on the circum
