Management is as old as the hills. There is nothing complicated about it at all. It is a natural function of human society. A man and a woman marry, set up housekeeping, and raise a

family. Both are managers. They manage as they buy a home, educate the children, plant a garden, pick out a car, a refrigerator, a piano. A hundred decisions a day around the house are management decisions.

This didn't just happen. Neither the men and women in industry nor the money in industry can be effective without good management. Nothing else is so important to the

workers' welfare, the investors' welfare or the public welfare.
