## BIG SEED CLEANING PLANT ASSURED FOR CROSS PLAINS AREA

Construction Begun Here By Local Man On South Main Street; To Open June 15th.

Cross Plains farmers were elated this week with the announcement that a large seed cleaning plant is to be installed here. Already construction has started on a building of 100 feet to house the concern. With 125,000 acres planted to hairy vetch in the Cross Plains area, 5,000 acres in the immediate vicinity of Cross Plains—and bumper yields forecast, growers were becoming concerned as to how seed would be cleaned in time for the peak marketing period. Present facilities were overtaxed last season and with increased acreage now maturing, farmers felt that the situation would be even more serious.
