## Dr. R. W. Varner, 70, Interred In Abilene

Funeral service for Dr. R. W. Varner of Route 1, Clyde, longtime Abilene physician and brother of Mary Priddy of Cross Plains, was held at 2 p.m. Thursday at Hillcrest Church of Christ in Abilene.

Dr. Varner, 70, died at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday of last week at an Abilene hospital after a lengthy illness.

Gene Hancock, Church of Christ minister, officiated the final rites. Burial was in Elmwood Memorial Park in Abilene, directed by Elliott-Hamil Funeral Home of Abilene.

Born Aug. 4, 1909, in Callahan County, he graduated from Baird High School and did premed work at Texas Tech at Lubbock. He graduated from Baylor Medical School in 1935 and set up practice in Abilene that same year. Dr. Varner owned and operated Cox Hospital in Abilene for many years. It was sold in 1975.

Dr. Varner was an Army Air Corps veteran of World War II. He was a member of Clyde Church of Christ. He married Marie Kennedy Dec. 24, 1937.

Survivors include his wife; a daughter, Sharon Ann Simpson of Honolulu, Hawaii; five sons, Darrell of Amarillo, Roy of Abilene, Larry of Uvalde, Terry L. of New Braunfels and David L. of Route 1, Clyde; a brother, Frank Varner of California; two sisters, Mary Priddy of Cross Plains and Blanche Nichols of San Saba; and four grandchildren.



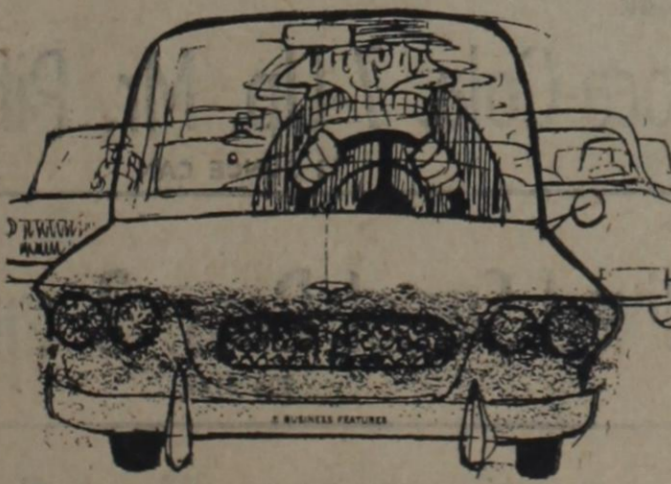
