Beginning May 9 , a new $65-\mathrm{mph}$
speed limit went into effect speed limit went into effect on rural
Interstate highways in Texas.
"The public is "The public is excited about this,"
said Byron Blaschke, deputy engineersaid Byron Blaschke, deputy engineer
director of the highway department, "and we are doing all we can to make a
smooth transition to the new speed smooth transition to the new speed
limit." limit." Friday, the highway commission established the new maximum speed
limit of 65 mph for cars and light trucks on rural Interstate highways. In this context, "rural" means outside urban areas of 50,000 or more people.
The governor concurred Wednesday The governor concurred Wednesday
with the new speed limit which becomes with the new speed limit which becomes
iffective at $12: 01$ a.m. Saturday, May 9 , effective at 12:01 a.s.
Some rural Interstate sections will continue with speed limits posted lower than 65 mph for traffic and engineering reasons. These reduced speed zones
existed before the 1974 federally manexisted before the 1974 federally man-
dated reduction to 55 mph . The department will examine each of these areas
and determine the need to continue of and determine the need to continue or discontinue the lower speeds. Blaschke emphasized that the new
limits apply only to rural highways with limits apply only to rural highways with

City Tax Report
City sales tax collections reported
May 6 still show the depressed
economic activity in Callent economic activity in Callahan County with collections funning 19.11 percent behind last year countywide. Statewide,
collection of the one percent city sales tax is 7.18 perceht lower than last year. Cross Plains is showing the largest decrease in collection, 36.37 percent behind 1986. Collection so far in 1987 have amounted to \$17.065.35, while
collections in 1986 had totaled $\$ 26,818.06$. The town received a payment for the month of April for $\$ 4,952.63$. The same payment the year before was St, 110.45 .
Clyde is reporting collections of $\$ 33,004.05$, which is 11.91 percent
lower than sales tax of $\$ 37,466.60$ lowerted in 1986. The town's payment
repor for the month was $\$ 9,940.33$. The check for the same month last year was $\$ 11,285.86$.
Baird is showing payments 11.06
behind last year Collections so far this behind last year. Collections so far this
year are $\$ 13,899.95$ and payments during the same time period last year amounted to $\$ 15,628.80$.
The town of Putnam has collections of $\$ 4.582 .74$ so far this year, an amount 5.25 percent lower than the 54.836 .69 figure reported in 188. The town's
