WTU Files for Increase in Rates

| West Texas Utilities Co, has filed for an increase in its retail electric rates, citing the costs of completing a new coal-fire power plant as making the move necessary. <br> We have said over and over again that it would be necessary to increase rates when our Oklaunion Power Station was completed," said Larry Cheshier, WTU's local manager in Cross Plains, adding that WTU's last rate request came almost three years ago. <br> The rate changes being sought would add $\$ 50,361,475$ to the Company's ameal retail revenue. This is a 23.9 percent increase over the test year ending March 31, on which the case is based. The request was filed May 19 with cities in the WTU service area and with the Public Utility Commission of Texas in Austin. <br> Mr. Cheshier said there is no such thing as a "typical customer," but thatthe new rates, if approved, would mean that a residential electric customer using 625 kilowatt-hours per month | would pay $\$ 10.83$ more per month than previously. A commercial customer using 1,500 kilowatt-hours would pay \$29.94 more. <br> "To put this request in its proper perspective, our overall residential revenues will be only six to eight percent higher than they were two years ago," Mr. Cheshier said. "The decline in fuel costs since then just about offsets this increase." <br> The Oklaunion Power Plant, situated near Vernon, went into commercial operation December 24, 1986.
