If you are eligible to vote, but he had a right to a detention Callahan County officials statvocal support, but I NEED and took were in the best interest Piantiff's attorney stated that they were not saying that Callahan County authorities did not have the right to arrest him (Smart), but we are saying that he had the right to be held in a suitable facility and to consult wtih an attorney Smart alleged that the jail did not meet minimum standars as prescribed by law, as many jails in this section of Texas have had trouble meeting the newly instituted standards, and his lawyer said he should have been transferred to Taylor County juvenile facilities which have also been decertified. Fillmon first arrested Smart in July 1976 after coming to Texas from Florida in August 1975. He was jailed for five days after an incident in Clyde. He reportedly had been in trouble in Florida and wanted to 'start over" in Texas. Smart was again arrested in Clyde on Aug. 12, 1976, a day after he led a DPS trooper on a high speed chase in a stolen car. It was wrecked in Eastland County and a companion was caught. During this time Smart said he did not see an attorney nor was he advised that he had a right to a hearing. Also he said that facilities in the jail were not up to standards, citing part of the time he was held in a 'maximum security" cell. He later was transferred to a larger cell usually reserved for women.
