ONION PLANTS SCARCE AND HIGHER

Reports from the onion growing section are that plants are scarce and getting higher each week. All plant orders during the week of February 25 to March 2nd will be \$3.50 per crate delivered to any town in Callahan county.

There has been a nice acreage planted to onions in this county this year regardless of the lateness of the rains. Many men saw the possibility last year of making a better profit from onions than any other of the intensely cultivated crops and their harvesting was done before the hot weather began. The county agent is extremely optimistic as to the future of this industry.

Mr. Ace Hickman is planting 1 acre on almost ideal soil for the crop and is going to irrigate. If no unforeseen calamity hits this crop the county agent believes it possible that 400 bushels may be grown.

1935 COTTON CONTRACTS ARRIVE

The first batch of 1935 cotton forms was received Monday, February 25. In all likelihood, the committee men will be ready for work in another week. They are already trained in the work, having had two days of schooling in the Baird office and most of them have had previous experience in the 1933 and 1934 programs.

ANT POISON

A few tubes of ant poison was distributed from this office last year and such good results were obtained that many persons have asked that a new order be placed. Two sizes are now available in the office. The garden size costs \$1.40 and the Estate size costs \$1.50. This is a jelly containing thallium sulphate and the U. S. Department of Agriculture has proven that it is probably the most successful poison known. It will kill silverfish and roaches along with rats and mice. The county agent is handling this for the consumers at cost.

Church of Christ

Unusual crowds were present at the regular services at the Church of Christ at Baird this last Sunday, the attendance at the Bible school classes at the morning hour being larger than it has been for several previous weeks. A mixed quartet from Abilene Christian College sang at both morning and evening services.

From 2:30 to 4:00 in the afternoon special singing and exhortation service was held. Visitors were present from Cisco, Oplin, Rowden, Midway, Clyde, Abilene, Putnam, and other congregations in Callahan county. Short talks were made by President Jas. F. Cox, of Abilene Christian College; J. G. Malphurs, minister of the Church of Christ of Clyde; and Leroy Brownlow, minister of the Church at Putnam. President spoke on "Giving the Bible a Chance," and stressed the importance of Sunday morning

Bible work.

Regular services next Sunday, according to announcement, will begin at ten o'clock and 7:15 respectively. Don H. Morris, minister, will speak at eleven o'clock on the Establishment of the Church", at which time announcement will be made concerning the subject for the evening service. Communion will be held at 11:45. An invitation is extended by the congregation to the citizenship of Baird to attend the services.

Home Demonstration Club News

County Home Demonstration Agent

"By being wardrobe Demonstrator for my Club, I feel that I shall be able to plan my clothes more satisfactorily and economically," says Miss Hazel Ogilvey, Wardrobe Demonstrator for the Cross Plains Home Demonstration Club.

Miss Ogilvey has reconditioned her closet, which is built in by adding a stronger rod for hangers, shoe racks and shoe bags. A Home Account Book is being used to keep her clothing expense in.

The white was used to lighten up the walls of my cellar, and to cover the shelves was a very inexpensive kind", says Mrs. Roland Nichols, 4-H Pantry Demonstrator for the 4-H Home Demonstration Club.

Mrs. Nichols used 1 gallon of the refuse or waste from a carbide lighting. 1 cup cup powdered glue and 1-2 cup salt to make the white wash. The carbide waste must be used while it is still in a liquid form, otherwise it will not spread evenly. This white wash will not brush or flake off, and may be used effectively for brick stone or wood surfaces.

Miss Kate Adele Hill, District Demonstrator for District 3, visited Baird Saturday.

The Callahan County Home Demonstration Council will have its regular meeting in the County court room at 2:30 Saturday afternoon, March 2.

County History and County Government will be subject of the meeting. "I am planning to use 500 feet of tile for sub-irrigation in my demonstration garden", says Mrs. Claude Foster 4-H Pantry Demonstrator for the Atwell Home Demonstration Club.

"The making of a food budget for my family has helped me a great deal in knowing what foods are healthful which ones contain the different vitamins, and minerals, and how often and how much of the various foods should be served daily and weekly," says Mrs. Henry Williams, 4-H Pantry Demonstrator for the Cross Plains Home Demonstration Club.

Mrs. Williams is interested in all the phases of the pantry demonstration and is pantry demonstrator for her club because she really wanted the job. The goals she would like to achieve are: 1. to plan a food budget to fit the needs of her individual family 2. Produce the foods to meet the demands of the budget, or to exchange for those foods which must be bought 3. Can, dry, brine or otherwise conserve the foods produced. 4. Label all jars and cans and organize her pantry 5. Complete a file of all tested recipes. 6. Assist cooperators to achieve their goals. 7. To take a part in any exhibits that the club might take part in in the county or in the community.

"It is a curious thing that men desiring success in business will see other merchants next door making a success by advertising and refusing to understand how it is done. "In every city in the country, large and small, are outstanding advertisers whose success is primarily and exclusively due to the extensive use of the local newspaper. An enterprising merchant comes to town and buys an old, rundown business and immediately cleans up the store, puts in a good stock and begins an advertising campaign. The first broadcast is a page in the local paper. This brings a fine business to the new store for several reasons. First, there is the element of curiosity; next, there are the offered bargains in the advertisement; and, third, the purchasers are comparing prices and quality to see if

the store is on the level and if they get the goods as advertised. It is important, of course, that the merchandise be handled properly and that it be worth the money.

"With this as a foundation, extensive advertising does the rest. The new store continues to carry a page at least once a week, sometimes two pages, and suddenly the people of that city are amazed to find the where the old store was a failure, the new store is doing an enormous business and making money.

"The queer thing is that other men in the same city fail to understand that they can do the same thing. One reason they do not is because they never have done it, and the other reason is that the cost of a page of advertising looms large to them and they are afraid to jump into the cold water.

"It is hard to break down the old habit of not advertising, but, after it once is started, it is harder to make the successful man stop advertising. Good Merchandising, Good Merchants.

Versatile Corn

Put corn in a rarebit or some combination— You'll find the results are just swell! Just make this a habit for your delectation, and use it in salads as well.

Here's the way to make the first dish mentioned in this doggerel. Corn and Pea Rarebit on Toast: Make a cheese sauce of two table-spoons butter, two tablespoons flour, one and one-half cups milk and one cup grated cheese. Drain the contents of an 8-ounce can of whole kernel corn and of an 11-ounce can of peas, and sauté a few minutes in two tablespoons butter, then add to the cheese sauce. Season to taste with salt and pepper, and serve on toast. Serves six to eight.

It Cottons to Carrots

The next two are combinations of corn and carrots and you'll find that they go very well together. The first costs only twenty-five cents.

Carrots and Corn O'Brien: Melt two tablespoons butter in a skillet, add one-half a green pepper, shredded, and half the contents of a No. 1 flat can of whole kernel corn, and sauté five minutes. Add the drained contents of an 8-ounce can of diced carrots and one table-spoon chopped pimiento, and season to taste with salt and pepper. Continue cooking until a golden brown. Serves four.

The second will serve two dozen people unless too many of them call for more.

Corn Salad: Marinate the contents of three 12-ounce cans of whole kernel corn and one and a half cups of grated or finely-chopped raw carrot in one cup French dressing for an hour or so in refrigerator. Add one cup shredded ripe olives, and serve in a nest of lettuce.*

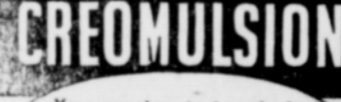
