Taking away from or leaving off something which God has said is just as misleading as adding words into the Bible which are not there. Some do not have an understanding of the scriptures because they have left off part of which is the divine word of God.

One of the most abused scriptures in this way is Mark 16:16. Jesus said. "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved. He that believeth not shall be damned." It is not at all uncommon to hear people say that they believe that baptism is not essential to salvation. In view of the above scriptures, such a statement is calling "non-essential" a plain statement of the Lord Jesus Christ. No wonder people do not understand the scriptures! If we can use such butchery as this on the scriptures, and still can it Christianity, we don't need the scriptures anyway. Man could just believe whatever he wanted to about salvation and be saved without so much as even having a savior.

Baptism is so that man may have the remission of his sins (Acts 2:38). Baptism puts one into Christ (Gal. 3:27). Baptism brings one into contact with the cleansing blood of Christ (Rom. 6:3,4). In baptism now saves us (1 Pet. 3:21). Baptism brings one into spiritual union with the body of Christ (1 Cor. 12:13). How can anyone mutilate the words of Christ to read, "He that believeth is saved without being baptized, because baptism is not essential?" If people will handle the word of God so carelessly (or permit it to be handled so carelessly), no wonder there is so much confusion and misunderstanding!




