DIVINE ESTEEM OF THE CHURCH

There is a very low estimate of the worth of the church in the hearts of many fine folks in our wonderful world. Like: "Jesus, Yes!" "The church, No!" "You don't have to belong to the church to be saved, or to go to heaven." But we learn in Acts 2:47 that the saved are the church.

"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto treasure hid in a field; the which when a man hath found, he hideth, and for joy thereof goeth and selleth all he hath, and buyeth that field. "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto a merchant man, seeking goodly pearls: Who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought it." Mt. 13:44-46.

Notice that both parables depict the worth and beauty of the kingdom of God. And that in both parables Jesus sets forth the fact that it cost all they had, and those who found it gladly gave all they had to have it.

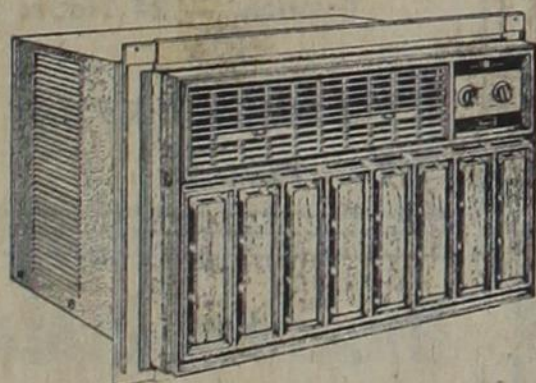
